of fishing. It is known even in the present day to have unexpected changes in weather with sudden and violent storms. In today's gospel, one of these storms catches Jesus and his disciples out on the sea and their boat begins to sink.

A small sinking boat in the midst of a storm on a huge lake is a good analogy for the early Christian Church. It was a small religious movement in the vast Roman Empire. There were many threats to its existence - the Jews, the Romans, the established cultures and civilizations that were part of the Empire such as the Greeks, Egyptians, and Persians, not to mention the barbarian tribes in Gaul, Germania, Britannia, Pannonia and Hispania.

There were many and seemingly insurmountable threats to the existence of the early Church. Yet, the mission given to the Apostles by Jesus was to "go and baptize all nations in the name of the Father, Son and Holy Spirit." The early Christians, by the power and working of the Holy Spirit, couldn't suppress the compulsion to evangelize. In the life of the early Church, there had to be many times when the faithful questioned, in light of the persecutions and the weight of the world against them, that Jesus did not "care that we are sinking."

In Galilee, Jesus commands the seas to be still. God is in charge. Jesus has authority over all creation, and he is the one who is the captain of the boat, even though he appears to be sleeping. In the midst of our concerns and fears for the Church and the evangelizing of the world today, we need to remember that Jesus remains the captain of the boat. He is the head of the Body of the Church. Despite whatever challenges we face in the present age, we are only following in the footsteps of our ancestors.

We are to take our cue from them. If we persevere in faith, following where Jesus calls us, then God's will be done. The sacraments of the church are Jesus in the boat sleeping on a cushion. In quite a profound way, Jesus actually is the boat. The sacraments bond us to Jesus and incorporate us into his body. If our boat is to be sunk by the world, then the world has to sink Jesus. That is not going to happen.
