PASTOR’S CORNER

So they said to him, “Sir, give us this bread always.” Jesus said to them, “I am the bread of life; whoever comes to me will never hunger, and whoever believes in me will never thirst.” John 6:34-35

Last Sunday we heard the first part of the sixth chapter of the Gospel of John. Jesus feeds 5,000 men by blessing and multiplying five barley loaves and two fish. It is an astonishing miracle that is then surpassed by what Jesus says next: “I am the bread of

life.” A discourse on what this means follows. It is what we hear today in our Gospel.

In the Bread of Life discourse Jesus offers us nothing less than total communion with the Divine. This is the pinnacle of existence for the soul. It is built upon the presumption of the soul being worthy to be in the presence of God. Implied in these few words are the forgiveness of sins and our restoration into God’s grace for eternity.

Eternal life in the presence of God cannot be measured in terms of fishes and loaves. Jesus makes a quantum leap from an earthly miracle of providing one meal to 5,000 people to offering all of humanity the forgiveness of sins and eternal life. Jesus accomplishes this heavenly work by giving himself to us while we are still on earth through the giving of the Holy Spirit and the Eucharist.

When we speak of the “Real Presence” of Jesus in the Eucharist, we are referring to the dogma of the Church that: “Under the consecrated species of bread and wine Christ himself, living and glorious, is present in a true, real and substantial manner: his Body and his Blood, with his soul and his divinity.” (CCC 1413) The Eucharist is not a symbolic representation of Jesus but really Jesus himself: his body, soul and divinity.

Thus, Jesus is the “Source and summit of the Christian life” (CCC 1324). He is both the companion on our journey of faith and conversion and is also our final destiny. In his book The Lamb’s Supper, Catholic theologian and apologist Scott Hahn speaks of the ancient belief that the Mass is heaven on earth because of the Real Presence of Jesus in the Eucharist. In heaven we will see God face to face, but on earth we are now able to celebrate a heavenly reality because the body, soul and divinity of Jesus is made present to us in the sacrifice of the Mass.

In anticipation of our celebration of St. Dominic’s Feast Day next Sunday, the parish is praying a novena to St. Dominic this week. Also this week is the Ordination Mass for Deacon Madison Hayes for the Archdiocese of Anchorage-Juneau. The Mass is at 6pm Friday at Our Lady of Guadalupe Cathedral. The Ordination Mass will be live streamed. Please keep Deacon Madison in your prayers in his final days before his ordination. He will return to Rome for another year of studies before beginning pastoral ministry in the Archdiocese and future full-time ministry in the Air Force.
