PASTOR'S CORNER

“Nor do they light a lamp and then put it under a bushel basket; it is set on a lampstand, where it gives light to all in the house.” Matthew 5:15

Today we celebrate the Solemnity of St. Dominic, founder of the Order of Preachers (The Dominicans). St. Dominic was born in Spain at the end of the 12th century. He became a priest of the Canons Regular. While traveling with his Bishop through the south of France, he encountered the Albigensian heresy that

had drawn entire cities away from the faith. Dominic saw the need for prayerful and educated preachers to re-evangelize the region. In December 1216, Pope Innocent III approved the foundation of a new religious order, "The Order of Preachers," which became known as "The Dominicans" after their founder St. Dominic.

One may ask, "Why do the Dominicans have the name 'Order of Preachers' when all Bishops, priests and deacons are called to preach the Gospel?" St. Dominic saw the need for educated preachers who were immersed in philosophical and theological studies. His idea was to combine a fully developed intellect with an intense life of prayer so that the fullest application of mind and soul would be directed toward knowing and loving God. The fruits of study and prayer would be shared with others through dogmatic preaching, writing and teaching.

One of the great spiritual insights of St. Dominic was that study is a form of prayer. Filling the mind and contemplating God's creation and revelation begins and ends with a desire to know God. Such an Order would be prepared to fight any heresy (false teachings) because it perpetually seeks to know and understand God and his ways. The best way to fight a heresy is to prevent it from taking root. The more readily understood and accessible the Divine truth is to a population, the less they are susceptible to falsehood and error.

To affirm St. Dominic's vision for the Order of Preachers, God blessed the Order with the vocation of St. Thomas Aquinas. St. Thomas Aquinas' philosophical and theological writings established such intellectual and spiritual grounding for the Church that, for nearly 800 years, his works have been an essential reference for the Catholic Faith and the formation of its clergy. What a better way to fight heresy than to start with a universal fortification and edification of the Church by illuminating the deposit of faith for all souls.

Last Sunday we said farewell to Br. Antony Cherian, OP, who served this past year at the parish. He returns to his studies for the priesthood at our seminary in Oakland, CA. I thank Br. Antony for his generosity of faith and service. Please keep him in your prayers as he continues his priestly formation. Each year we are blessed to have a Dominican student brother make his pastoral residency year with us. Brothers who have also recently completed residency years with us continue to progress towards ordination. Br. Josh Gatus, OP, (2017-2018) was ordained to the diaconate in June. Br. Columban Hall, OP, (2018-2019) made his solemn profession of vows in May. Br. Andrew Thomas Kang, OP, (2019-2020), will be making his solemn profession of vows next May.
