The Summer Olympics have come and gone. Some of our parishioners followed the events and kept current with the medal count. For me it was the first year that I didn't follow it, even from afar. Our Dominican Novices were visiting along with others and I lost track of the time. Five years ago in the old rectory (these Olympics were postponed a year due to COVID) Frs. Mark Francis, Dominic, Chris and I, watched the events on several evenings. The quality of the experience was enhanced because we watched it as a community.

I recall one of the brothers commenting how the Olympics is one of few moments in public life where the collective glory of humanity outshines the glorification of the individual. In this case, those who earned a medal are raised up before others but their accomplishment also fittingly directs attention to the higher glory of human excellence and achievement. Something that so many can appreciate and celebrate. The motto of the Olympics is one that speaks of excellence: "Citius, Altius, Fortius" which means "Faster, Higher, Stronger" It was adapted at the formation of the original International Olympic Committee and was inspired by the Dominican Friar, Fr. Henri Didion, OP.

The collective glory of human excellence points toward heaven and God our creator. I am reminded of the 139<sup>th</sup> Psalm: "I praise you because I am wonderfully made; wonderful are your works."

Vanity, which is referred to in our Gospel today, is a sin regarding the pursuit of personal glorification over the glorification of God. Jesus accuses the Pharisees of using the law and the customary practices of their faith for their personal elevation and glorification among men. He accuses them of type of blasphemy and calls them hypocrites. He points out their folly and enumerates the sins that emerge from their worldliness not only to defend himself against their accusations but also as an act of charitable correction.

Vain people seek worldly recognition among men, viewing themselves primarily from the standpoint of self-promotion and image. Those people are not concerned about glorifying God. This sin is more prevalent in our current age, where social media and self-expression lead to an elevated concern about one's image and standing among others. The virtues needed to resist vanity are modesty and magnanimity. Modesty seeks proper decorum and comportment. It resists seeking attention for the purpose of false promotion and elevation. Magnanimity is a virtue that prompts one to desire and seek great things in virtue because they are good and glorify God.

The desire for glory is not a bad thing in and of itself. The key question is where that esteem and glory comes from. God shares his glory with us through the life of Jesus. The Incarnation itself is an incomprehensible elevation and glorification of humanity. The Blessed Virgin Mary is also a breathtaking elevation and glorification of humanity. The graces given to us in the life of the Church and the Sacraments sanctify us and unite us to Christ whereby we share in his glory before all of heaven and earth. By this reckoning, everyone is invited to the highest glory there is. Eternal glory with God through His power, might, and charity.
