FOURTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

St. Paul's 13th chapter in his letter to the Corinthians is commonly known as the Hymn To Charity. You may be familiar with the Greek word 'agape' which is what we translate as 'charity.' Naturally there are other types of love: love of things (I love chocolate chip cookies/sunsets/massages/bicycling/but mostly the cookies), love between family members (parents & children, or child to siblings), love between husband and wife (romantic love), and love between friends. Some would say that friendship is the purest natural love a human can have because when we love our friends we would do anything for them just because they are our friend. As they say, "a good friend will bail you out of jail....A best friend will be sitting next to you in the cell!" (Please do not commit any crimes in the name of friendship!)

Charity (aka agape) is a type of love that the world had not known before Christ walked among us.

Love, the charity of which St Paul is speaking, has nothing to do with selfish desire for physical passionate possession; nor is it restricted to mere philanthropy, whose motivation is purely humanitarian: charity is a love which is to be found in the new order of things established by Christ; its origin, content and purpose are radically new; it is born of the love of God for men, a love so intense that he sacrificed his only-begotten Son (Jn 3:16). The Christian is enabled to respond to this love of God by this gift of the Holy Spirit, charity (cf. Gal 5:22; Rom 15:30), and by virtue of this divine love he discovers God in his neighbour: he recognizes that all are children of the one Father and brothers and sisters of Jesus Christ: "Our love is not to be confused with sentimentality or mere good fellowship, nor with that somewhat questionable zeal to help others in order to convince ourselves of our superiority. Rather, it means living in peace with our neighbour, venerating the image of God that is found in each and every person and doing all we can to get them in their turn to contemplate that image and learn to turn to Christ" (St Josemaría Escrivá, *Friends of God*, 230).

A couple of thank yous came our way last week. The Retirement Fund for Religious gave thanks for our outstanding generosity of \$13,276.00 to help so many retired religious who have given their lives in service to the Lord and the Church. St Mary Church and their St. Vincent de Paul Food Pantry thanks Incarnation Parishioners for their most generous gifts and support. They are very grateful for the generous support that they received this past December from the Incarnation Church Christmas Kindness program. "Your donations of food and gifts for the 245 children of the 99 families who registered for our Christmas distribution program truly helped each one have a blessed Christmas!

With Fr. George working down south, Fr. Smith and I discussed Sunday Masses. I talked with Fr. Smith about whether we ought to work to find a replacement for Fr. George. I related that many priests in the archdiocese have at least three Masses a weekend and some have four a weekend. Personally, my assignments for the past eighteen years found me presiding at a least three, and for most Sundays, four Masses a weekend. He agreed that the two of us would cover the Masses ourselves for several months and see how it goes. I appreciate his openness to testing upper limits. Even as I am disappointed that I won't be able to greet people before Masses at which I don't preside, I'm happy because I'll get the most mileage out of a homily each weekend!

Attention retired parishioners, I would like to put out a call for funeral Mass servers! Many parishes rely on trained retired parishioners to serve funeral Masses. Currently, we don't have servers at funerals. Rather, Pastoral Associate, Stacy Stang, servers much of the Mass, while also having several other responsibilities. I'd like to free her up for more direct bereavement ministry. Therefore, if you are a retired man or woman please wonder if Jesus might be calling you to the corporal work of mercy of helping to bury the dead as a funeral Mass server. Please call the office and leave your name and phone number!

Thanks to those who had their throats blessed at the end of Masses today. This is a tradition which will be re-introduced here at Incarnation, on a Sunday near the Presentation of the Lord, February 2 and St. Blaise, February 3.

Dear Incarnation Parishioners,

Recently we asked Fr. Pat to bless a box of handmade cord Rosaries. After a beautiful blessing Fr. Pat asked us about our Rosary project. Fr. asked if we would write our Rosary Story for the Sunday bulletin. Here goes....

My 95 year old mother, Betty Bresser, makes Rosaries. Mom, a lifelong Catholic, is the mother of 14 children (not a misprint...), grandmother of 44 and great grandmother of 80. About 7 years ago Mom found herself with extra time and a need to do something useful. This is when Mom became a Rosary maker. Mom has never taken the easy way; she always manages to put her heart and soul into her day, rarely doing things in small quantities. Please know, my Mom is a serious hoot... she can still out cook most and win at cards - you pick the game.

Mom purchased her first PC in her 80's and proceeded directly to enroll in a PC Intermediate course, believing the entry level course would be too basic for her... Mom's mind is sharp and her heart is strong but her ankles are bad, so she uses a walker. Still, with her gnarled fingers, Mom averages making 10 Rosaries each day. When Mom doesn't have her

typical 70 rosaries ready to be blessed by Friday noon Mass at Immaculate Heart in Cincinnati, she is apologetic and vows to pick up her pace for the next week....

To date, Mom has made over 25,000 Rosaries! During the first years we gifted Mom's Rosaries to various missions and put baskets with a Free Blessed Rosaries sign in the back of our parish churches. This changed a few years ago when I attended the weekday school Mass at St. Henry's. Into church walked kids - grade after grade - each child reverently holding a cord rosary! Many of the kid's rosaries appeared to me to be made by my mom - Fr. Shearer had blessed and received mom's handmade rosaries in previous years. After Mass a couple children walked to the pulpit and began leading the student body in the Rosary. A church filled with all those young voices in prayer was so amazingly wonderful. It was a beautiful sight, one of those WOW moments!

My sisters and I discussed all of this with mom and we then shifted our Rosary distribution to Catholic grade schools. What better way than to use mom's rosaries to help our schools teach children this powerful prayer. To this end, we gift Rosaries to grade schools to be used like hymnals from year to year. We also gift Rosary binders containing how to say the Rosary, its prayers, mysteries, promises, miracles, etc., (a Fr. Stretch suggestion.) This aid helps the children feel more comfortable when leading the Rosary and acts as a guide showing how this prayer has helped so many people over the centuries.

To date we've gifted 11,000 rosaries to over 25 schools in our archdiocese and schools in New Mexico, North Dakota, Alabama, South Africa and Senegal, West Africa. We ask each school receiving Rosaries to pray a Rosary, a decade or the Chaplet, after the weekly school Mass when possible. Our hope is to have children learn the Rosary and treasure it as a life-long prayer. Mom say's Our Lady's Fatima message is clear- to pray the Rosary every day, and Montfort say's the easiest way to heaven is thru Mary, so this is our attempt to spread this direction. We are sure Our Blessed Mother smiles and will do the rest.
