
Obviously for God – “Yes Always”

2019 has passed and we have entered into 2020, a new year. It is considered customary to convey New Year's wishes, prayers and blessings to family, neighbors and friends. It is also a custom for individuals to make New Year's resolutions, which some will accomplish, while others will quickly forget their promises. Whether we accomplish these resolutions or not, time, as the saying goes, waits for no one. So, what happens? We get older each day whether we achieve anything or not. In the face of this quandary, here is a short reflection, the spirit of which is drawn from “Sr. Clare Maria of the Trinity and the Heart of Mary.” Is it possible to say “yes” to God always? This question became a challenge for her as it does for everyone whether they are a committed religious, a father, a mother, a brother, a sister, or someone else.

Sr. Clare was born into a traditional Catholic family in Northern Ireland. From her early childhood, she had always dreamt of becoming a famous movie star, and she was working her way towards that dream. She had the qualities; at the age of 15, she was contracted to host a show for young people on Channel 4, one of the biggest in the UK. Later, at 17 she began to work for Nickelodeon, an American Channel. Then, during Holy Week 2000, someone told her to go to church. So, she went and sat in the last pew. It was Good Friday and she observed the ceremony of kissing the cross, an imitation of that on which Jesus was crucified. After the ceremony, she remained in the church weeping and saying to herself, “He died for me, He loves me, Why hasn't anyone told me this before?” She was comforted by a religious nun, but later forgot about it and turned away, once again to pursue her dream. Back in Ireland, when she was actively engaged in the filming of the movie “Sunday,” directed by Charles McDougall, something happened and she heard the voice of Jesus asking her, “Why do you continue to hurt me?” That was the end of becoming a famous movie star. Now, no one believed that she was going to become a nun, because everyone knew how she had lived; her mother begged her to give up her desire and told her, “You can't stay even a week.” But Sr. Clare remained in the convent and became a nun, a happy nun with a guitar who inspired many lives to come back to God.

It was not very easy for her to embrace the lifestyle of the convent, but she took it as a challenge and lived it. At the beginning, when she was asked what she wanted to become, with a big smile she would always respond that she wanted



to become a “Famous Nun.” She took her perpetual vows on September 8, 2010, in the congregation of the “Servant Sisters of the Home of the Mother.” She served in many places; and, wherever she lived, she was happy and made everyone around her happy. “Even on days when she was tired,” Sr. Kelly Maria Pezo recalls, “when she sang, she kept nothing back. And when she lived, she kept nothing back; she was always giving.” When someone would ask her about it, she would gladly say, “when my Lord gave Himself for me, He gave Himself completely for me, and did not withhold anything. This is my inspiration and I must give, and give completely.” Sr. Ana Maria admired Sr. Clare’s obedience; she claimed, “Whenever someone asked Sr. Clare for any kind of help, she was very happy to do it for them.” When asked about the spirit with which she approached life, Sr. Clare said, “Obviously, God can ask me anything at any time and I am always ready to do it.” The same words became more real than anyone had imagined. On April 16, 2016 during lunch, Sr. Clare and the other sisters were talking about death; Sr. Clare declared, “Why should I be afraid of death if I am going to go with the One I have longed to be with my whole life?” On the same evening around 6:58 pm, there was an earthquake that took the lives of Sr. Clare and the other five young aspirants. Obviously, God can ask me anything at any time and I will do it. Not just doing it; but instead, doing it to the full - giving like Jesus, who gave till the last drop of his blood, not holding back anything, He shed every drop of blood for me and you and fulfilled His Father’s will. This reflection inspires a few questions for the New Year's resolutions: How much are you giving without counting the cost? What stops you from giving? If you are tired of giving, look at Him - He, too, was tired; but He continued to give until He gave everything? “He died for me. He loves me. Obviously, He gave me everything.” So, say “Yes” to Him always.” Saying “yes” to Him means a lot, doing and being responsible to the core.

Challenges and Remedies for Youth

CUDDALORE - The second classical academy for the 2019-2020 curriculum year was held on December 2nd. The initiation brothers organized this second academy. The chief guest was Mr. Lourdsamy, their English teacher. The topic of the academy was "Challenges and Remedies of the Youth Today". This topic was considered more relevant and timely for today's youth as well as for



the seminarians. The topic was divided into three parts, First, Br. Kuzhandhai, from Tamil Nadu, introduced and elucidated the topic; he focused more about the power and achievements of

the youth. He said in the walk of life they encounter many opportunities and challenges. Some succeed and some meet failures. Second, Br. Chottulal, from Orissa, spoke about the challenges they encounter in family, society and around the work place. The third orator was Br. Vamsi, from Andhra Pradesh, who gave consolation through some means and methods for the youth to withstand all the struggles and problems. There were also many other cultural events performed by the Initiation and Higher Secondary brothers. Mr. Lourdsamy gave his presidential address and the academy concluded with the papal anthem.

A New Beginning

Guanella Preethi Nivas Celebrates

BANGALORE - The GPN community celebrated the 13th annual World Special People's Day on December



7th. Around 2000 children from 40 institutions attended the event at GPN. Fr. Ronald, Provincial Superior, opened the celebration with the holy Eucharist. After Mass there was a cultural program for the children to prove their talents and show that they are normal people. Over 300 volunteers from various parishes, seminaries and colleges helped throughout the day. We shared meals with the special children. The chief guest distributed gifts for each institution.

Tamil Academy
