St. Joseph, Patron of the Universal Church - 2021 the Year of St. Joseph



March 19 is the solemnity of St. Joseph, husband of the Virgin Mary, foster father of Jesus, and patron of the universal Church. On May 1, we honour St. Joseph as the patron of workers. Most of the reliable information on St. Joseph is contained in the first two chapters of the Gospels of Matthew and Luke. Here we discover that Joseph was of royal descent from David, that the family was from Bethlehem in Judea and that Joseph, who was a builder, had moved from Bethlehem to Nazareth in Galilee.

Joseph was engaged to Mary and upon learning that she was pregnant; he had plans to divorce her. Described as a righteous man, he intended to dismiss her quietly. Then an angel of the Lord appeared to him in a dream to tell him, "Joseph, son of David, do not fear to take Mary your wife, for that which is conceived in her is of the Holy Spirit; she will bear a son, and you shall call his name Jesus, for he will save his people from their sins" (Mt 1:20-21). "When Joseph woke from sleep he did as the angel of the Lord commanded him." (Mt 1: 24).

St. Joseph was a humble, obedient man of God who acted out of love for his family. He listened to God and always put God's will above his own desires and plans. Pope Francis tells us: Saint Joseph is venerated as the "guardian" of the Holy Family, and in this role he serves as a model for all fathers and educators. (if you want to read the Pope Francis letter: *With a Father's Heart Patris corde* - touch the title). The Holy Father wrote it in 2020 against the backdrop of the Covid-19 pandemic, which, he says, has helped us see more clearly the importance of "ordinary" people who, though far from the limelight, exercise patience and offer hope every day. In this, they resemble Saint Joseph, *the man who goes unnoticed, a daily, discreet and hidden presence, who nonetheless played an incomparable role in the history of salvation.*

Joseph quietly imparted to Jesus that wisdom which consists above all in reverence for the Lord, prayer and fidelity to his word, and obedience to his will. Joseph's paternal example helped Jesus to grow, on a human level, in his understanding and appreciation of his unique relationship to his heavenly Father. May Saint Joseph be a sure guide to all parents, grandparents, priests and teachers charged with the education of our young people. Fr. Peter

Ewangelia Jana opowiada o tym, jak Jezus przy pomocy bicia ze sznurków, *powyrzucił wszystkich ze świątyni, także baranki i woły, porzucił monety bankierów, a stoły powyrzucił mówiąc nie róbcie z domu Ojca mego targowiska*. Gdy faryzeusze żądali znaku, Jezus dał im taką odpowiedź: **Zburzcie tę świątynię, a Ja w trzech dniach wzniosę ją na nowo, a my wiemy, że mówił o świątyni swego ciała. Gdy więc zmartwychwstał, przypomnieli [to] sobie uczniowie Jego**. W XXI wieku Jezus nadal jest zgorszeniem i głupstwem dla świata, ale my we wspólnocie Kościoła wyznajemy, że poza Nim nie ma zbawienia. Podziękujmy na nowo za dar wiary i Jezusowe przykazanie miłości, które jest dopełnieniem prawa zawartego w 10 przykazaniach. **Modlitwa, post, jałmużna – istota Wielkiego Postu!** Z modlitwą – ks.
