St. Andrew the Tribune is known as the Great Martyr and was a leader of converts in the Roman Army.

Andrew and his men faced a battle against the Persians and called upon Christ for aid. They were victorious.

Andrew and some of his troops became Christians and were discharged from military service.

They were baptized by Bishop Peter of Caesarea and arrested by military leaders and executed in the Taurus Mountains of Cilicia.
