1. We are making approximately 100 calls per day to check on parishioners and will continue to follow up. Morale is good, and most people have food and supplies they need. Please let us know if you can volunteer to shop for others.
2. Blessed Palms will be available on Friday, Saturday, and Sunday from 9am to 7pm on the patio tables by the Miccosukee Road entrance to the Hall. I definitely am not encouraging special trips but if you are in the area for essential travel you can pick up Palms.
3. Our Live Streaming Masses allow us to come together in prayer. Our Mass schedule is:
  - Monday through Friday - 8:30am & 5:30pm
  - Saturday - 8:30am & 5:00pm Vigil
  - Sunday – 8:00am & 5:00pm

4. Stations of the Cross streams Live on Fridays at 6:00pm.
5. Adoration Chapel hours have changed due to the curfew. The Chapel is open and the Eucharist is exposed from 6:00am until 10:30pm.
