 - Good Friday – Stations of the Cross 3:00pm / Service 7:00pm
 - Easter Vigil – 8:00pm
 - Easter Sunday – 10:30am
4. **Regular Weekly Masses:**
 - Monday through Friday - 8:30am & 5:30pm
 - Saturday - 8:30am & 5:00pm Vigil
 - Sunday – 8:00am & 5:00pm
5. **Stations of the Cross:** Join us for live streamed Stations of the Cross Fridays at 6:00pm.
6. **Adoration Chapel:** The Chapel is open and the Eucharist is exposed from 6:00am until 10:30pm.
 - Eucharistic Adoration is a religious function and technically you can be there.
 - I discourage adorers that are 65 and older if they have any health concerns.
 - Please use normal procedures to get substitute if you do not come.
7. **Office Hours:** Parish staff are working Monday – Friday, 9am - 4pm to conduct essential business. We take your calls, answer email, and manage essential activities. If you are in need, please call us.
