LITURGY OF THE DAY

We return today to Sundays in Ordinary Time. In a sense “Ordinary Time” is time that falls outside the major holy seasons of the year: Easter, Christmas, Advent, and Lent. But Ordinary Time is not just the absence of a major season any more than our lives are ordinary on days that are not holidays. Ordinary Time forms the foundation of the liturgical year; after all, it comprises almost two-thirds of the calendar. May we appreciate the heft of Ordinary Time as we settle into the longest season of the year.

LITURGIA DEL DÍA

Hoy regresamos a los domingos del tiempo Ordinario. En cierta manera el “tiempo Ordinario es aquel que está fuera de los tiempos fuertes y más sagrados del año, esto es, la Pascua, la Navidad, el Adviento y la Cuaresma. Pero el tiempo Ordinario no es sólo la ausencia de un tiempo fuerte tal como nuestra vida no es ordinaria en los días que no son festivos. El tiempo Ordinario es el cimiento del año litúrgico; después de todo, comprende casi dos tercios del calendario. Que podamos apreciar el alcance que tiene el tiempo Ordinario ya que ahora vamos entrando al tiempo más largo del año.

**SAINT ANTHONY OF PADUA

St. Anthony was born Fernando Martins to a wealthy family in Lisbon, Portugal, in 1195. He entered the Augustinian monastery at the age of 15. After two years he was transferred to the motherhouse of the congregation, the Abbey of Santa Cruz in Coimbra, and was eventually ordained a priest. While he was a priest at the Augustinian monastery, the remains of a group of Franciscan martyrs were brought to the Abbey via a large cortege. Inspired by their example, Fernando said to the Franciscans, “Brother, I would gladly put on the habit of your Order if you would promise to send me as soon as possible to the land of the Saracens, that I may gain the crown of the holy martyrs.” Upon obtaining permission to join the newly established Franciscan Order, Fernando changed his name to Anthony. St. Anthony traveled to Morocco but soon fell ill. While attempting to return to Portugal, his ship was detoured to Sicily due to a violent storm and high winds. While recovering, Anthony spent his time praying and studying at a hermitage. During a visit from Dominican friars, Anthony was called up to give a homily. Though he tried to decline, he ended up giving the homily, surprising everyone with his eloquence, passion, and holiness. Thereafter, Anthony’s preaching became widely respected. St. Anthony of Padua died on June 13, 1231, at the age of 36 at the Poor Clare monastery at Arcella, Italy (now part of Padua). Anthony of Padua was canonized within the year by Pope Gregory IX (his friend).

Capital Campaign Announcement (III)

Some frequently asked questions about the On the Way - ¡Ándale! Capital Campaign:

How are the parish targets set and how much is my parish going to receive?

The campaign target for each parish is established at 1.3 times its average offertory for the last three fiscal years. Parishes with a three-year average offertory of \$500,000 or less will receive 40%; offertory between \$500,000 and \$1.3 million will receive 35%; and those with an offertory over \$1.3 million will receive 30%.

If the parish does not reach their monetary target, is it responsible for the difference?

Parishes will not be assessed penalties if they do not reach their fundraising target. The expectation is that parishes put forth a good faith effort to follow the recommendations of the archdiocese and the Steier Group in conducting the campaign.

Will funds for the On the Way - ¡Ándale! Capital Campaign reduce offertory support for the parish?

It is important to emphasize that all gifts to this campaign should not reduce other giving commitments to the Church. A gift to the campaign is an extraordinarily generous gift made freely and faithfully to meet the extraordinary challenges and opportunities presented through the campaign.

Anuncio de la Campaña Capital (III)

He aquí algunas de las preguntas mas frecuentes acerca de la Campaña Capital On the Way - ¡Ándale!:

¿Cómo se determinan los objetivos de la parroquia y cuanto recibirá mi parroquia?

El objetivo de la campaña para cada parroquia se establece en 1.3 veces el monto de su ofertorio promedio de los últimos tres años fiscales. Las parroquias con un ofertorio promedio en tres años de \$500,000 o menos, recibirán en 40%; las parroquias con un ofertorio de entre \$500,000 y \$1.3 millones, recibirán el 35%, y aquellas con un ofertorio superior a \$1.3 millones, recibirán el 30%.

Si la parroquia no alcanza su objetivo monetario, ¿es responsable de la diferencia?

Las parroquias no serán sancionadas si no alcanzan su objetivo de recaudación de fondos. La expectativa es que las parroquias hagan un esfuerzo de buena fe para seguir las recomendaciones de la Arquidiócesis y el Grupo Steier en la realización de la campaña.

¿Los fondos para la Campaña Capital On the Way - ¡Ándale! reducirán los donativos de apoyo para la parroquia?

Al presentar la campaña, será importante enfatizar que todos los aportes a la misma no reducirán otros compromisos de donaciones a la Iglesia. Un donativo a la campaña es un regalo generoso, hecho libre y fielmente para enfrentar los extraordinarios desafíos y oportunidades presentados a través de la campaña.

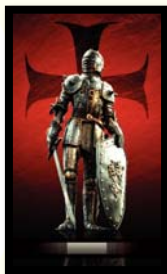

TRADICIONES DE NUESTRA FE

San Antonio de Padua (Fernando de Bulloes y Taveira de Azevedo) nació en Lisboa, Portugal, en 1195; a los 15 años ingresó a los Canónigos Regulares de San Agustín, pero diez años después ingresó a los Frailes Menores Franciscanos donde a los 25 años adoptó el nombre de Antonio. Tenía voz clara y fuerte, memoria prodigiosa y un profundo conocimiento, el espíritu de profecía y un extraordinario don de milagros. Su fama de obrar actos prodigiosos nunca ha disminuido y aún en la actualidad es reconocido como el más grande taumaturgo de todos los tiempos. El Papa Gregorio IX lo canonizó menos de un año después de su muerte en Pentecostés el 30 de Mayo de 1232. Su fiesta se celebra el 13 de Junio.
