Fourteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time

Luke 10:1-12, 17-20

“Jesus appointed seventy-two others whom he sent ahead of him in pairs to every town he intended to visit.”

When the twelve returned and reported what they had done in his name, Jesus began to prepare them for the reaction of the Roman and Jewish leaders. He spent time with them in prayer, was transformed before them and attracted thousands whom he fed with fish, bread and spiritual food. He then appointed seventy-two others to go in pairs to towns he intended to visit. They were to take no money, no provisions and no sandals. They were to rely on the response of the people who received them in peace and to whom they preached and healed, physically and spiritually. They went in pairs, some possibly as married couples, and did as Jesus instructed. They returned with reports of performing great deeds and realized that they did not need a money bag, or sack with their possessions or even sandals, to do great things in the name of Jesus. Through the twelve, and then the seventy-two, Jesus is teaching us that faith in God and the truth of His message is all we need to do great things for others. Do we have such faith?

Celebration of the Sacraments

Marriage- Contact Fr. Julian or Deacons Jack or Tom for any Marriage and Annulment need.

Anointing of the Sick- Anyone who is seriously ill or going to surgery should request anointing by contacting Fr. Julian.

Fourteenth Sunday In Ordinary Time YRC

In the first reading from (Isaiah 66:10): The prophet describes in poetic and symbolic language the prosperity and peace which the new Jerusalem will enjoy. His intention was to encourage the returned exiles who were depressed and downcast when they saw their beloved capital in ruins. He assured them that, this state of affairs will soon end and Jerusalem will be greater than ever, more peaceful and more prosperous than she ever was before. He calls on his fellow Jews to rejoice and be glad.



In the second reading (Galatians 6:14-18): Paul insists that the Christian life means becoming like Christ. He himself bears marks of Christ's passion on his body.

In today's Gospel (Luke 10:1-12, 17-20): We see the sending out of the 72 disciples

THEME: 72 Disciples As Bearers Of Peace

Let us look at the sending out of the 72 disciples. When Jesus sent out the 72 disciples He said to them (Luke 10:6) "whatever house you enter, first say peace be to this house." They were to be ambassadors of peace and good will. Without peace nothing is possible. Here is a short story.

One morning in Northern Ireland, in the height of the troubles, a Catholic priest went across the road the local Protestant church, to wish the minister and his congregation a happy Christmas. The minister received him warmly, reciprocated his greetings and later made a return visit. However, some elders of his church reacted angrily and took steps to have the minister removed from the parish. And Jesus said, "Blessed are the peacemakers, they shall be called children of God" (Matthew 5:9).

Those two clergymen felt that they were only doing what Christ would want them to do - to be an instrument of peace and reconciliation in a troubled and divided society.

Peace is not a negative thing. It is just the absence of war or enmity. Peace is a positive thing. It implies openness, friendship, tolerance, goodwill, hospitality, and reconciliation. It disposes us to reach out to others. It helps us to break down barriers of suspicion, fear, prejudice, and bigotry.

Working for peace means welcoming the people close to us, those who annoy us or disagree with us, and those who provoke anguish in us. To take the path of peace is to accept people as they are, with all their limitations and weaknesses. The people we need to make peace with are not our friends but our enemies. Jesus bequeathed the gift of peace to His disciples "peace be with you" (John 20:20).

Shortly before communion the priest says to us the peace of the Lord be with you always. What a wonderful gift is being offered to us - the peace of Christ, a peace which the world cannot give. Then he invites us to offer each other a sign of peace. The hand we reach out to our neighbors is the same hand with which we receive Jesus in communion.

We come to Mass to receive blessings from the Lord. If we took nothing else away with us from here but peace, our time would be well spent. We must be prepared to give back something of what we have received. The end of Mass is not like the end of a football game or movie film where we simply get up and leave. At the end of the Mass we are sent out. Having received the peace of Christ, we are then sent out as ambassadors of that peace to others.

My dear friends, if we wish to be effective messengers of peace three things are necessary. Firstly, we have to have peace ourselves. Secondly, we have to be willing to share that peace with others. And thirdly, the other person has to be willing to receive it from us.

May the God of peace bless us with his peace. Amen!

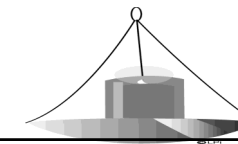
