Celebration of the Sacraments

Baptism- takes place every 3rd Sunday, during or outside of Mass. Contact Fr. Julian or Deacons Jack, Tom, or Wayne to set a meeting to prepare for the Sacrament and set a date. Baptism for older youth and adults occurs at the Easter Vigil.

Confession- Saturdays, 4:30 pm, before or after any Mass or by appointment with Fr. Julian. Communal services during Advent and Lent.

First Reconciliation- is celebrated during Advent.

First Eucharist- is celebrated during May each year with children in the second grade or older.

Confirmation- for youth is conferred by the Bishop. Adults receive the Sacrament at the Easter Vigil or before Marriage by Fr. Julian.

Holy Orders- Contact Fr. Julian or Deacons Jack or Tom if you are interested in the vocations of Priesthood, Diaconate or Religious.

Marriage- Contact Fr. Julian or Deacons Jack or Tom for any Marriage and Annulment need.

Anointing of the Sick- Anyone who is seriously ill or going to surgery should request anointing by contacting Fr. Julian.

Seventeenth Sunday In Ordinary Time YRC

The first reading, (Gen 18:2—32) Abraham intercedes with God on behalf of Sodom, a city full of evil.

The second reading, (Col 2:12-14) Through baptism a Christian dies to the old sinful way of life, and rises to live a new life.

Gospel of (LK 11:1-13) Jesus urges the apostles to pray to God with childlike trust for all their spiritual and temporal needs.

Dear friends, prayer forms the subject of the first reading. In the first reading, we see Abraham interceding with God on behalf of Sodom, a city full of evil. Troubled by the idea of the innocent being punished along with the guilty, he begins to bargain with God. The story highlights the importance of intercessory prayer, and reveals a lot about the mercy of God.

This prepares us for the Gospel which shows Jesus at prayer and contains the Lord's prayer. Jesus urges the disciples to go on asking for what they need with persistence and confidence.

The Lord's Prayer

One of his disciples said to Him, Lord, teach us to pray as John taught his disciples." (LK11:1) Jesus then taught them Our Lord's prayer. The Our Father is the first and greatest of all Christian prayers. It's short and simple phrases embrace every relation between us and God. It not only tells us what to pray for, but also how to pray for it.

However, it tends to be said to hurriedly and unthinkably that much of its meaning is lost. This is a pity, because properly understood, the Our Father contains a whole program for Christian living. If we were to live up to what it contains, we would be perfectly in tune with the mind of Christ because undoubtedly this is how Jesus himself lived.

The first part deals with God. We begin by acknowledging God's existence and calling him Father. God is a parent to us and we are His children. Sometimes he acts like a Father, and sometimes a mother. Then, we praise His name. In praising His name we praise Him. We pray for the coming of His kingdom- a kingdom of truth and life, holiness and grace, justice, love and peace. We have a part to play in making His kingdom a reality. We pray that His will may be done on earth. On earth means in our lives too. God's will may not always be the easiest thing to do, but it is always the best thing.

The second part deals with us and our needs. We begin by praying for our daily "Bread" which stands for all our material needs. All we really need however, is enough for today. We pray for forgiveness for our own sins, and for the grace to be able to forgive those who sin against us. Inability to forgive others makes it impossible for us to receive God's forgiveness.

We pray not to be led into temptation of our own accord. We are asking God to help us to cope with the temptations that come to us unbidden, and to avoid those of our own choosing.

Finally, we pray to be delivered from all evil, both physical and moral. We can't expect to never encounter evil, but especially moral evil.

Dear friends, we should notice that the whole of our Father is couched in plural terms. This shows that we are one family under God and that there can be no salvation for us independent of others. My brothers and sisters, with the midnight friends encounter Jesus urges us to persevere in our prayer. If God does not answer our first request, our perseverance will prove to Him how deserving our case is and he will answer. For he says ask and it will be given to you. Seek, and you shall find. Knock, and it will be opened to you! These three expressions stresses the need for perseverance in prayer. Our heavenly Father is generous and kind. His store is unlimited. His love is infinite.

We might ask today what our prayer reveals about our own relationship with God. Can we say we pray constantly? Does our prayer begin with praise of with accusing God of punishing us or hurting us? In our prayer, do we ask God to kill our enemies? Do we beg for more than we need, or do we ask for what we need right now? Does our prayer reveal that we realize our ongoing dependence on God or do we turn to god only when we are desperate? Prayer can help us. Prayer can heal us. Prayer can keep us out of trouble. Prayer can keep us healthy when we stay connected to God, everything goes better. Prayer can teach us to be at peace.

May the good Lord hear and answer our prayers always in Jesus' name. Amen.

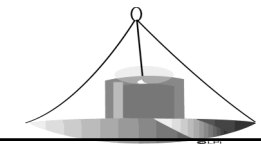
