"Some who are last will be first, and some who are first will be last."

A football team from an elite high school took the field wearing the newest uniforms and best equipment. Their coaches were the best money could buy. The opposing team from a high school in a poor neighborhood came on the field wearing old and worn pads, scarred helmets and jerseys that had been handed down for years. Nothing matched. The coaches were volunteers. Who do you think won the game? Who would you cheer for? Do we try to understand the plight of those who struggle for the bare necessities of life: food, clean water, shelter, clothing and basic education? Or do we associate with those we think have it made, or made more than they need for themselves? The disciples asked Jesus if only a few would be saved. Jesus answered that all can be saved, but those who believe they will be saved by keeping company with the rich, the famous and the powerful will find it difficult to enter the Kingdom. They can do it, but they must be strong enough to also associate with those in need

Twenty-First Sunday Ordinary Time YRC

The first reading (Isaiah 66:18-21) presents a vision of all peoples coming to Jerusalem to share in the blessings God has conferred on Israel.

The second reading, (Hebrews 12:5-7, 11-13) tells us that as a father shows his concern for his son by training him in discipline, so God trains His children through suffering.

In the Gospel reading (Luke 13:22-30), Luke tells us that the Kingdom of God is offered, not just to the Jews, but to people from the four corners of the world.

Reflection Theme: Will Only A Few Be Saved

As Jesus was making His way to Jerusalem someone asked Him "Sir/Lord will only a few people be saved?" (Luke 13:22).

While the questioner who asked how many will be saved needed a direct answer from Christ, nevertheless it was made very clear to him and to all of us that each one's salvation is in his or her own hands. All those who accept Christ, His teachings, and the helps He has made available to them, will enter the kingdom of God. On the other hand, those who are excluded from that eternal kingdom will have only themselves to blame. God invites all men to heaven. He gives all the help necessary to every man and woman, but because human beings have free will God cannot force them to accept His invitation. Some will abuse that freedom and choose wrongly.

Christ mentions the narrow path through which we must enter into God's Kingdom (Luke 13:24). This means that we must exercise self restraint and mortification. This we do when we respect and keep His commandments. When we are called to judgement it will be too late to shout "Lord open for us" (Luke 13:25). We should have sought His mercy and His forgiveness during our earthly Life and He would have granted it.

We have a free will. We can choose to pass that final examination or fail it. The whole of our eternity, the unending life after death, depends on our choice now. If we choose to follow Christ and live according to His laws during the few years we have on this earth, we shall pass and shall be among the saved. If we ignore Christ and His laws now, He will not know us on the day of judgement. God forbid we should choose to ignore Christ and His laws. Dear friends in Christ, salvation depends on the favor of God and the honest struggle to follow his ways.

May the Lord guide and strengthen us with His grace and mercy in our earthly trials and tribulations on the road to heaven. Amen!
