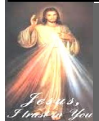

Our images of God are often formed early in life. Sadly, those images are of a severe, vengeful God like a policeman waiting to pounce on us for doing something wrong or a judge who takes things away from us as a punishment. Jesus taught of about a God who loves us unconditionally and wants us to discover, accept, develop and use all of the talents, abilities and gifts he gave us for our own benefit and enjoyment, and the benefit and enjoyment of others. God created us to share eternal life with him after a life of being all that he created us to be. Nicodemus, a Pharisee, who came to Jesus in the night so as not to be seen as one of his followers. He had a image of a severe God, but he respected Jesus as a teacher who had come from God. Celebration of the Sacraments

Confession- Saturdays, 4:30 pm, before or after any Mass or by appointment with Fr. Julian.

Communal services during Advent and Lent.

First Reconciliation- is celebrated during Advent.

First Eucharist- is celebrated during May each year with children in the second grade or older.

Confirmation- for youth is conferred by the Bishop. Adults receive the Sacrament at the Easter Vigil or before Marriage by Fr. Julian.

Marriage- Contact Fr. Julian or Deacons Jack, Tom or Wayne for Marriage and Annulment needs.

Holy Orders- Contact Fr. Julian or Deacons Jack, Tom or Wayne if you are interested in the vocations of Priesthood, Diaconate or Religious.

Anointing of the Sick- Anyone who is seriously ill or going to surgery should request anointing by contacting Fr. Julian.

The Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity (YRA)



First Reading (Exodus 34:4-6, 8-9) The Lord passed before Moses and cried out, "The Lord, the Lord, a merciful and gracious God, slow to anger, rich in kindness and fidelity." Moses seeing the Lord bowed down to the ground in worship. Then he said, "If now I have found favor in your sight, O Lord, I pray let the Lord go with us."

Second Reading (2 Corinthians 13:11-13) St Paul blessed the Corinthian community with the perfect love and unity that exists between the Blessed Trinity. He greeted them thus, "The grace of the Lord Jesus Christ, the Love of God, and the Fellowship of the Holy Spirit be with all of you."

Gospel (John 3:16-18) "For God so loved the world that he gave his only Son, so that everyone who believes in him may not perish but may have eternal life."

Reflection Theme

Today we encounter the mystery of all mysteries, the mystery that underlies our faith and our entire spiritual lives. It is a mystery too great for many people to accept.

The fact that there are three persons in the One God has been clearly revealed by Christ Himself. He spoke of being equal to the Father, then He spoke of the Holy Spirit as a person with distinct actions of His own, whom He and the Father will send on earth to complete the work of man's salvation.

The church accepted this fact and this doctrine without hesitation from its very beginning as it was given to it on Christ's undoubted and undoubtable authority. As Christians then we accept without question that there are three persons in One God and we bow down in humble adoration before them. As Christ's authority to speak came from the Father (John 12:49), the authority of the Holy Spirit will be from the Son and the Father, who is in Christ the Son (John 14:10). The truth He will announce will be spoken with the authority of the three Divine Persons. St Paul's word in (Romans 5:1-5) shows us the three Divine Persons cooperating on our behalf. The Father, Son, and Holy Spirit have each a part in the work of enabling us, finite creatures, to share in their infinite happiness.

In today's celebration as we honor the Blessed Trinity, the three Divine Persons, our central thought should concentrate on gratitude to each of the three, the loving Father who planned not only our creation, but our elevation to adopted children, the all obedient loving Son, who carried out the Father's plan sharing with us our humanity so that we could share in the divinity, the Holy Spirit, fruit of the love of Father and Son who has come to dwell in the church and in each individual member, in order to fill our hearts with a true love of God.

Friends in Christ, as we celebrate today the Solemnity of the Blessed Trinity, may God the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit grant us the strength to overcome our human weakness and live and die in their love so that we may share their eternal kingdom with them. Amen.

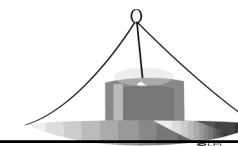
