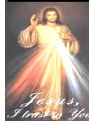

Without judging them, it is fair to wonder if their spirit is dead. We can feel sorrow for them; offer them help; try to show them by our deeds and words about God's love for them, whatever their situation. But we can learn from them to pray that we continually grow in our faith and live our faith by what we say and do. Then someone may be able to kill our body, but no one can kill our soul.

Celebration of the Sacraments

Confession- Saturdays, 4:30 pm, before or after any Mass or by appointment with Fr. Julian.

First Eucharist- is celebrated during May each year with children in the second grade or older.

Confirmation- for youth is conferred by the Bishop. Adults receive the Sacrament at the Easter Vigil or before Marriage by Fr. Julian.

Marriage- Contact Fr. Julian or Deacons Jack, Tom or Wayne for Marriage and Annulment needs.

Holy Orders- Contact Fr. Julian or Deacons Jack, Tom or Wayne if you are interested in the vocations of Priesthood, Diaconate or Religious.

Anointing of the Sick- Anyone who is seriously ill or going to surgery should request anointing by contacting Fr. Julian.

First Reading (Jerimiah 20:10-13) Jeremiah makes his complaint, his lament, but then he recalls that God stands with him. He turns to God and trusts God to do whatever is best.



Second Reading (Romans 5 12:15) For if by the offense of the one man all died, much more did the grace of God and the gracious gift of the one man, Jesus Christ abound for all (Rm 5:15).

Gospel (Matthew 10:26-33) Jesus says that our heavenly Father knows even the number of hairs on our head.

Reflection Theme:

Positive self-image to love and succeed in life.

Dear Friends in Christ,

If anyone should have a positive self-image, we should. As Christians who are made in the image and likeness of His own (Genesis 1:27) and the Lord God says to each one of us today, "Do not be afraid for I have redeemed you; I have called your name and you are mine (Isaiah 43:1). And because we are made in the image of God, Jesus said in today's Gospel that "In Gods eyes we have a worth and a value beyond counting. He loves us with an infinite love. He love us and values us so much that he sent his only son to save us from sin (John 3:16). It is important, then, that we treat one another in the same way that Our Father has treated us. It is important that we convey to others the same message He has conveyed to us; that we are valuable and lovable beyond all counting. If we treat others in a way less than this, we convey to them a lie, a terrible lie. We tell them they are not valuable or loveable. Not only do we lie to them, we also destroy their ability to love as scripture teaches them. For if we give them the idea that they are worthless and unlovable, they will not be able to give themselves in love to another.

Today's Gospel speaks an important message to us. It says that we are valuable and lovable. God Himself has told us so. He even calls us by name and also made us His own. It is up to us to speak the same message of love to one another, especially the young. Their future well-being, not only in this world, but also in the world to come depends on it.

Dear friends in Christ, remember today's lessons, in the First Reading Jeremiah, in his complaint and lament he remembered that the Lord is with him. Likewise, we should remember always that the Lord is with us in our suffering and in our sickness even as this difficult time of COVID19. Second, he had recourse to God for vengeance. For the Lord says, vengeance is mine (Roman 12:19). Third, we are valuable and loveable beyond all counting. Lastly, Jesus said, "As the Father has loved me, so I have loved you. I have told you this so that my own joy may be in you and that your joy may be complete. This then is what I command you. Love one another (John 15:9, 11-17).

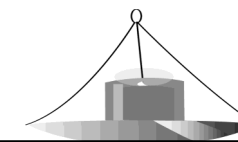
