Overview

Catechist Background

What role does your body play in your relationship with God?

Sometimes we think religion involves our minds, and perhaps our hearts, but not our bodies. We may think of our bodies as confined to the realm of the secular. Jesus, however, was interested in the mind, heart, and body. He took a special interest in those who were sick. In the Gospels we find many stories of Jesus healing and curing. Jesus' concern was not only that people no longer suffer, but that they come to know God's mercy and love.

Jesus' healing ministry became an important part of the Church's ministry. From its beginning, the Church, led by the Apostles, healed in Jesus' name, a practice that continues to this day. Christ's "preferential love for the sick has not ceased through the centuries to draw the very special attention of Christians toward all those who suffer in body and soul. It is the source of tireless efforts to comfort them" (CCC 1503).

In sickness, we experience powerlessness, limitation, and finitude (CCC 1500). Because of these effects, some people in our society try to avoid the

presence of suffering and disguise the reality of death. In contrast, Christians believe we must offer comfort and hope to those who are suffering and dying. We do this most readily through the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick. In this sacrament, God's grace and comfort are given to those who are seriously ill, suffering the effects of old age, or are in danger of death. This sacrament renews the person's trust and faith in God. It might help restore those afflicted to health or give them strength to endure. Through the prayers and support of the Church's community, those facing death can do so with the hope of eternal life with God. Those who are suffering or dying can be strengthened by their belief in the crucified but risen Lord.
