The Diocese has received multiple reports from parishioners who have fallen victim to a recent internet email phishing scam. The scam begins when the parishioner exchanges a series of emails from an imposter who assumes the name of the local parish pastor. The email will ask the parishioner to buy iTunes gift cards for some cause (like a cancer victim) and then to transmit the photo of the gift cards with the numbers revealed to the imposter.
