Guidelines for Resumption of Public Masses @ St. Peter-All Hallows' Parish.

We are pleased to resume the Celebration of Mass in our Church.

1. Church Reopening: Saturday, June 13th & Sunday, June 14th, with all seven Masses.

2. **Space is limited to 85 and attendees must call office @ 916-456-7206, to reserve seating. You must call every week no later than Thursday prior to each weekend.** Vulnerable ages 65+ and persons with compromised health are asked to continue with shelter-in-place, until further notice. Masses will continue to be Live Streamed at 10:30a.m. + 12:30p.m. every Sunday.

3. **Attendees MUST wear face masks and temperatures will be taken before Mass with hand sanitizer available at the entrance. Please arrive 20 minutes ahead of time to check in.**

4. Enter and exit through the main front door only. Doors will be closed during Mass. Once we reach 85 people, the doors will be closed and no one else let in.

5. Ushers will provide directions or additional instructions as you enter the vestibule. Please practice patience.

6. Only pews marked with safe distancing can be filled, families who live together may sit together. The Chapel will remain closed.

7. Communion to the homebound is halted until further notice.

8. Communion will only be distributed on the hand. Extend your hand to receive the host. Take a step to the side, remove your mask and consume the host. Once you have consumed the host place your mask back on and return to your pew.

9. Please keep your face mask on until you enter your car. Gathering of people outside is not recommended.

10. Reminder If you are feeling sick or exhibiting symptoms, PLEASE STAY HOME

11. If you have been in contact with someone with COVID-19, PLEASE STAY HOME.

12. Please note that your mask needs to cover your mouth and nose!

Reflection on Holy Trinity Sunday

The mystery of the Holy Trinity is totally beyond my comprehension so I can't offer any insights. Your sense of it is better than mine. But there is something in today's gospel reading that I will call to your attention. John tells us that Jesus came to save the world, not to condemn it. We think of salvation almost exclusively as a forgiveness of sin and the opening of the gates of heaven. Salvation was about temporal, day-to-day life for biblical writers and for Jesus. This understanding is crucial for us today as we try to make sense of chaos in our streets.

Governor Newsom addressed Californians last week, saying that the root cause of racism and all that follows in its wake, a moral failure. He urged us to change our hearts. Jesus put it another way when he proclaimed, ". . . the reign of God is at hand, repent." Another word for repentance is "conversion." The U. S. Bishops were explicit in their condemnation of racism and recent events. They said that we face a real and present danger and our response must be ". . . in a spirit of determined conversion." Can conversion lead to our salvation from the evils that are devouring us?

Jesus' understanding of salvation was both spiritual and temporal. He forgave sins, taught us how to understand God's love, and how to pray. He showed us the way to eternal life. But salvation also means a good life here on earth. To that end he healed the sick, fed the hungry, and cast out demons. We must confront evil just as he did. That's why so many Christians favor health insurance for the poor and opposed cuts to the food stamp program. How can we exorcise the evil of racism?

We can pray for victims and for the conversion of sinners, ourselves included. Education, through our schools, parish programs, and from the pulpit can be a powerful tool. Also, we can continue to support helping agencies. Above all, we can follow leaders who offer us a better life rather than condemnation, just as Jesus did.
