Guidelines for Resumption of Public Masses @ St. Peter-All Hallows' Parish.

1. **Space is limited to 71 and attendees must call the office @ 916-456-7206, to reserve seating. You must call every week no later than 12:00pm Thursday prior to each weekend.** Vulnerable ages 65+ and persons with compromised health are asked to continue with shelter-in-place, until further notice. Masses will continue to be Live Streamed at 10:30a.m. + 12:30p.m. every Sunday.

2. **Attendees MUST wear face masks covering their nose and mouth and temperatures will be taken before Mass with hand sanitizer available at the entrance. Please arrive 20 minutes ahead of time to check in.**

3. Enter and exit through the main front door only. Doors will be closed during Mass. Once we reach 71 people, the doors will be closed and no one else let in.

4. Ushers will provide directions or additional instructions as you enter the vestibule. Please practice patience.

5. Only pews marked with safe distancing can be filled, families who live together may sit together. **The Chapel will remain closed.**

6. Communion to the homebound is halted until further notice.

7. Communion will only be distributed on the hand. Extend your hand to receive the host. Take a step to the side, remove your mask and consume the host. Once you have consumed the host place your mask back on and return to your pew.

8. Please keep your face mask on until you enter your car. Gathering of people outside is not recommended.

9. Reminder If you are feeling sick or exhibiting symptoms, **PLEASE STAY HOME**

10. If you have been in contact with someone with COVID-19, **PLEASE STAY HOME.**

Reflection on 13th Sunday in Ordinary Time

In today's gospel reading, Jesus tells us that whoever received a prophet receives a prophet's reward. Whoever receives a righteous person will receive a righteous person's reward. How do we receive prophets and righteous men and women today? What reward can we expect?

In our first reading from the second Book of Kings, an unnamed woman of influence knows Elisha will pass through her vicinity. She extends hospitality to the prophet in the form of a nicely furnished room. In gratitude, Elisha promises to reward her with a son even though her husband is old. There will be a miraculous birth, a son, a new life.

Paul, in his letter to the Romans, also speaks of new life, of resurrection for the followers of Christ. But how are we to prepare for that kind of reward? Jesus tells us we must love him more than we love our parents. We must also love him more than we love our children. Interestingly, he does not refer to spousal love. Love can be very challenging and demanding. He also tells us to take up our crosses and follow him. Today in the pandemic's midst, we have plenty of crosses. Jesus mentions one specific thing we can do and living in Sacramento's heat we can relate to; give a cup of cold water to one of these little ones. Biblical writers sometimes referred to the poor as little ones. Perhaps the writers were contrasting them to wealthy who were often referred to as the great ones.

Today's readings come full circle; we receive the prophets and the righteous in our midst by loving Christ and others. Love demands that we take up our cross and offer refreshment to the poor. In doing so, we stand to receive the reward of the prophet and the righteous; resurrection and new life.
