### Guidelines for Resumption of Public Masses @ St. Peter-All Hallows' Parish.

- Space is limited to 71 and attendees must call the office @ 916-456-7206, to reserve seating. You must call every week no later than 12:00pm Thursday prior to each weekend.** Vulnerable ages 65+ and persons with compromised health are asked to continue with shelter-in-place, until further notice. Masses will continue to be Live Streamed at 10:30a.m. + 12:30p.m. every Sunday.
- Attendees MUST wear face masks covering their nose and mouth and temperatures will be taken before Mass with hand sanitizer available at the entrance. Please arrive 20 minutes ahead of time to check in. If your mask does not cover your nose it is very ineffective!!**
- Enter and exit through the main front door only. Doors will be closed during Mass. Once we reach 71 people, the doors will be closed and no one else let in.
- Ushers will provide directions or additional instructions as you enter the vestibule. Please practice patience.
- Only pews marked with safe distancing can be filled, families who live together may sit together. **The Chapel will remain closed.**
- Communion to the homebound is halted until further notice.
- Communion will only be distributed on the hand. Extend your hand to receive the host. Take a step to the side, remove your mask and consume the host. Once you have consumed the host place your mask back on and return to your pew.
- Please keep your face mask on until you enter your car. Gathering of people outside is not recommended.
- Reminder If you are feeling sick or exhibiting symptoms, **PLEASE STAY HOME**
- If you have been in contact with someone with COVID-19, **PLEASE STAY HOME.**

## July 12, 2020 Fifteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time

### Reflection on 15th Sunday in Ordinary Time

For the next few Sundays, our gospel readings will explore the nature of the Reign of God. In the extended version of today's passage from Matthew, Jesus stresses the importance of our understanding the concept because if we don't, the Evil One will snack away what Jesus has sown in our hearts, namely the Good News of Jesus Christ.

Scholars today tell us that the words Reign of God, Kingdom of God, and Kingdom of God are all interchangeable. But back when I was a student, I learned that Kingdom, referred to a geographic place and Reign, referred to the ruler and time when the monarch ruled. Today Queen Elizabeth reigns over the Kingdom of England. In ancient Jewish creation stories, God ruled the world, but Satan tempted people away from God and asked him to rule. Adam and Eve may be a case in point. The result of our rejection of God's reign meant that Satan ruled our world, and the hallmarks of that rule were hatred, sickness, and death.

Jesus announced that the Reign of God is now at hand, repent, and believe the good news. He meant to defeat Satan and restore the world to the Reign of God. God wants the opposite of what Satan has established so; love must triumph over hate, the sick must be healed, and life must overcome death. Jesus' preaching, miracles, and resurrection are signs that the Reign of God is at hand. But we have to repent and believe.

If the Reign of God is taking place here and now, we have to do as Christ did; love others instead of hate, heal the sick, hope in the resurrection, and believe the gospel. The pandemic makes discipleship harder. Grief and fear are all around us, and it's challenging to stay focused on what Christ is telling us today. We can't let the Evil One snatch away the vision and hope that Christ has sown in our hearts. We have to be the good soil.
