Changes in Celebration of Mass On July 13, 2020, our Governor stated that Places of worship have been closed to indoor celebrations.

Bishop Soto is allowing the following changes in the Sacramento Catholic Diocese and will apply at St. Peter-All Hallows' Parish: *Outdoor Masses*

Act of Spiritual Communion:

O my Jesus, I believe that you are truly present in the Most Holy Sacrament of the altar. I love you above all things and desire to receive you in the Eucharist. Since I cannot receive you sacramentally at this time, I beg you, dear Lord, come into my heart spiritually and refresh my soul. I adore you with profound reverence; I embrace you and unite myself wholly to you. Never permit me to be separated from you.

Reflection on 16th Sunday in Ordinary Time

We, as individuals and as a society, are struggling with the concept of justice. The treatment of justice in today's readings is both challenging and reassuring. The passage from the Book of Wisdom tells us that because God is all-powerful, God is the source of all justice. But God's power does not equate with might. The author of the book explains that God's mastery over all things makes God lenient to all. God's justice is made visible in kindness. Is it an act of divinely inspired clemency when a president frees a man convicted for committing felonies for that very president? Is resuming the use of capital punishment, merciful? Are racist or violent policing policies lenient? God's justice seems a long way off, and there is not much an individual can do about it. Or is there?

The parables Jesus uses today captures the complexity of our situation and one's sense of helplessness in the face of our enamors justice challenges. It seems natural to feel as small as that little mustard choking in weeds. But Jesus assures us that there is hope. The tiny seed will survive and grow tall. How? St. Paul has the answer in today's second reading. The Spirit comes to us in our weakness. Paul tells us to search our hearts and pray. Is it God's justice in my heart or am I being judgemental? That injustice comes from the Evil One. Prayer can lead to understanding, understanding to action, and action to justice.

In the early days of John XXIII's papacy, he discovered that wages for lay workers in the Vatican were so low that many had to find a second job. He ordered substantial pay increases for the workers. A panicked accountant hastened to tell that pope that if he gave those kinds of raises, they would have to reduce contributions to Vatican Charities. The pope told him, "Justice comes before charity." The workers got their increase, and the charities were still served.
