Changes in Celebration of Mass as of July 30, 2020

On July 13, 2020, our Governor stated that Places of worship have been closed to indoor celebrations.

Bishop Soto is allowing the following changes in the Sacramento Catholic Diocese and they will apply to St. Peter-All Hallows' Parish: *Outdoor Masses:*

Due to the extreme heat, Saturdays and Sundays there will be NO evening Masses.

Sundays: There will be a 6:00am, Spanish Mass and an 8:00am English Mass in the Rectory Courtyard. Because of Social Distancing capacity is limited to 36 people. Face Masks still apply. Please register before Thursday at 12 noon by calling the Parish Office @ 916-456-7206

12:30pm, Spanish Mass, Live Streaming Continues. Not Open for public celebration.

Changes in Confessions times!

Due to the extreme heat these days, our confession times are as follows: Tuesday from 9:00am to 10:00am for English and Spanish speaking and Saturdays from 9:00am to 10:00am, English speaking only. All Confessions will still be in the Msgr. Corkell Parish Hall.

Act of Spiritual Communion:

O my Jesus, I believe that you are truly present in the Most Holy Sacrament of the altar. I love you above all things and desire to receive you in the Eucharist. Since I cannot receive you sacramentally at this time, I beg you, dear Lord, come into my heart spiritually and refresh my soul. I adore you with profound reverence; I embrace you and unite myself wholly to you. Never permit me to be separated from you.

Reflection on 19th Sunday in Ordinary Time

These are frightening times. We face a pandemic, social unrest, and institutional wrongdoing. Today's Mass readings offer a timely antidote to our fears; faith.

In our reading from the First Book of Kings, Elijah has fled the wrath of the evil King Ahab and his wife, Jezebel. He is cowering in a cave. God promised to come to his rescue. The prophet endures a firestorm, violent winds, and an earthquake, but God is not present in any of these forces of nature. Instead, the rescuer appears in the form of a ". . . tiny whispering sound."

The forces of nature are again raging in our gospel passage from Matthew. The disciples are crossing the sea of Galilee ahead of Jesus when a sudden violent storm threatens to destroy their boat and drown them. Jesus approaches them walking on the churning waters. He tells the disciples to take courage. Do not be afraid. Peter is emboldened enough to step out onto the waters himself. As he is approaching Jesus, he suddenly realizes that walking on water is a mistake. Fear gets the best of him. Peter is not always portrayed as the brightest of the twelve, but as he sinks under the waves, he calls out, "Lord, save me!" Good call. Jesus extends a supportive arm and spells out the disciple's mistake. Overcome your doubt with a little more faith.

St. Paul, in today's passage from Romans, tells us that his ". . . conscience joins with the Holy Spirit in bearing me, witness." Shakespeare got it wrong when he had Hamlet say, ". . . conscience does make cowards of us all." In our conscience, God whispers to us, and Jesus tells us, take courage and do not be afraid. Sheltering in place and not hearing the noise of so many cars and planes, it's a little easier to listen to that whisper. But it takes a lot of faith to step out of the boat and into the churning waters. It's good to remember that if we do and start sinking, Jesus is there to lend a hand. We just have to ask for help. Keep calm and carry on! .
