## Reflection on 22nd Sunday in Ordinary Time

How does a person determine God's will in his or her life? Once that's figured out, how does one go about doing God's will? Today's mass readings offer some guidance.

In his letter to the Romans, Paul tells us we must renew our minds to discern God's will. Some people can make decisions without batting an eye. But when faced with critical and consequential choices, we take our time and deliberate carefully. Think back to when you chose a school for yourself or your child, bought a house, or decided on a meaningful relationship. Odds are, a lot of thought and examination went into the decision. Perusing God's will follows the same process and more. We reflect on scripture, consult with pastors or spiritual directors, teachers, and fellow disciples. In time, you can know what God wants you to do. You may or may not like where the process takes you. Jeremiah sure didn't.

Our first reading today is referred to as Jeremiah's despair. He knows all too well, in the marrow of his bones, what God wants of him. He also knows that doing the will of God will make him a laughingstock. People will ridicule him. But God's will is irresistible. He has no choice but to follow his passion and do God's will. Can we do the same?

In Matthew's gospel, Jesus tells us what God's will is for us, his disciples. We are to pick up our crosses and follow him. We must bear our sufferings just as he did. There is no shortage of crosses; pandemic, unemployment, wildfires, and loneliness, just to name a few. In another part of Matthew's gospel, Jesus chastises the Pharisees for putting burdens on people that they can't bear. Is he implying that we should ease the burdens of others, even if we have our own crosses to carry? Yes.

In the middle of all our trials, we are reaching out to others in need. We are still contributing to our parish St. Vincent de Paul Society, even though many of us are struggling right now. Many are donating money for wildfire evacuees through the Red Cross. Some of us are even giving blood. All of us are praying for hurting people in Mass every Sunday in our Intersessions and in private prayers.

Can we do the will of God and support each other while carrying our own crosses? Yes, we can. Yes, we are. So just keep calm and carry on.
