Reflection on 23rd Sunday in Ordinary Time

In today's gospel, Jesus instructs us to approach and confront wrongdoers. Ezekiel goes one step further. If we fail to correct their misdeeds, they will be punished, but God will hold us responsible for their failure. How can we correct someone in these times of emotionally heightened political tensions? Three weeks ago, the Zimbabwe Catholic Bishops' Conference (ZCBC) published "The March is Not Ended." In that pastoral letter, they define the servant political leadership needed to address many crises. They described a leadership that unites rather than divides the people. One that promotes dialogue rather than demagoguery while resisting violent reactions to peaceful protests and dissent. Leaders that fight corruption. Without naming names, the bishops bluntly stated that current leadership is not up to the task.

Every four years, our United States Conference of Catholic Bishops (USCCB) reissues its voting responsibilities statement. In a new introduction, they described a moral leader as someone who models love, righteousness, justice, prudence, and courage. The good leader also models civil dialogue when dealing with opposition. They also identified problems facing our culture; inequality, racism, abortion, and xenophobia, to mention a few. In keeping with federal law, no individual candidates were endorsed or disapproved of by name.

The president and government in Zimbabwe reacted as all tyrants do when confronted by prophets. They denounced their bishops as evil and enemies of the state. But surrounding South African countries, the European Union, the Vatican, and other countries lent support to the Bishops. The people of Zimbabwe united behind their bishops.

Last April, Cardinal Timothy Dolan of New York appeared as a guest on a Fox News show. In that appearance, he praised our president for his leadership qualities and all that he was doing for people of faith. Two days earlier, the president asked 200 Catholic church leaders, including Cardinal Dolan, to turn out the vote for him in a private conference call. Given this context, many took Dolan's enthusiastic praise as an endorsement of the president. The president and his followers, we're grateful for Cardinal Dolan's support. Not all Catholics agreed. There was an adverse reaction to the Cardinal's endorsement in several national Catholic publications. In New York, polls, the president's opposition is ahead by 26%. It appears that faithful of his archdiocese do not think the president meets the leadership requirements spelled out by the USCCB.

In the matter of "fraternal correction," the Holy Spirit guides the Catholic church and each of the faithful. We can hear the voice of the Spirit in the depth of our conscience. In my conscience, the Spirit speaks with an African accent, not a New Yorker's.
