On July 13, 2020, our Governor stated that Places of worship have been closed to indoor celebrations.

**Bishop Soto is allowing the following changes in the Sacramento Catholic Diocese and they will apply to St. Peter-All Hallows' Parish: Outdoor Masses:**

### Reflection on 24th Sunday in Ordinary Time

Imagine anxiously waiting for three days, fearful that your Covid-19 test may come back positive. Now imagine your relief and joy when you get the email telling you tested negative and healthy. Being forgiven feels like that. But those emotions are just the beginning. Forgiveness has the power to change hearts.

In today's passage from Sirach the prophet asks, "Could anyone nourish anger against another and expect healing from the Lord?" Jesus seems to answer this question with the parable of the king and the unforgiving servant. The servant mistook foreignness for just being let off the hook. His failure to change and become more compassionate amounted to a refusal of the gift of forgiveness.

In the parochial grade school, I attended, many years ago, the entire student body went to communion on the first Friday of every month. That meant we had to go to confession every first Thursday, whether or not we had any sins to confess. Getting out of class and walking to the church next door was fun. Confession? Not so much. Kneeling in a small, dark confessional waiting for the sound of the screen sliding open and hearing the priest whispering Latin prayers was scary. I would confess my sins and then respond to father's questions with a yes father or no father. After saying I was sorry, I would pledge to do better. Father would give me a penance and then the magic words, ego te absolvo. I absolve you. I emerged from the confessional ten pounds lighter and resolved to be a better person. I kept my pledge, at least for a little while. I was a better person. This power of forgiveness is not restricted to the confessional.

We were newlyweds when I pointed out that my wife had been gullible in a particular matter. Instantly, there was a wailing and the gnashing of teeth. My bride morphed into She Who Must Be Obeyed. Feeling instant remorse (and fear), I apologized profusely. The next day she forgave me. Her ability to forgive has proven to be the glue that holds our marriage together. I suspect it's the saving grace of a lot of relationships. I have not uttered the word gullible in any context for over 30 years. Ego te absolvo.
