On July 13, 2020, our Governor stated that Places of worship have been closed to indoor celebrations.

Bishop Soto is allowing the following changes in the Sacramento Catholic Diocese and they will apply to St. Peter-All Hallows' Parish: Outdoor Masses:

Reflection on 25th Sunday in Ordinary Time

Commentators often focus on the oblivious theme of the parable of the generous landowner in today's gospel reading. God is generous. But preaching a generous God would not get someone crucified. There's more here than meets the eye. Jesus is not only talking about God. He is also talking about the reign of God.

The landowner hired workers at different times of the work day. The first hired, worked a full day. Those hired at various times throughout the day worked less. The landowner paid the group that worked the least amount of hours a full day's wages and he paid them first. When he eventually paid the group that worked the longest the same wage and paid them last, they felt cheated. Those disgruntled workers felt that those who worked less should be paid less or that those who were first in the field should be paid more.

The workers who were hired last waited all day for someone to hire them. No one did. They were at the back of the line and rejected by perspective employers. The generous landlord took these rejects and put them at the front of the line. This is not how things are done under the reign of Caesar.

If we look to the back of the line today we can see DACA recipients. Our government feels that they have not earned citizenship. Their parents were deported and walled off at our southern border for the same reason. We can also see people of color, subjected to institutional racism and women victimized by cultural sexism. Also at the back of the line are people who cannot afford health insurance. Like the poor in our country they have not earned enough money to pay it. Today's parable speaks to us about them and under whose reign we live.

The parable of the generous landlord depicts a generous God's reign that is radically different from the reign of Caesar. Jesus wanted his followers to help establish God's reign on earth here and now. That radical and treasonous proclaim action lead to his crucifixion. People who advocate for those at the back of the line today do not go to the cross. They are subjected to demeaning presidential Twitter rants.
