**Bishop Soto is allowing the following changes in the Sacramento Catholic Diocese and they will apply to St. Peter-All Hallows' Parish: Outdoor Masses:**

### Reflection on 26th Sunday in Ordinary Time

In today's Gospel reading, Jesus contrasts the responses of two children to a parent's instructions. When assigned a task by the parent, the first child refuses but then reconsiders and obeys the parent's command. The second child does the opposite, verbally accepting responsibility for a task but never following through and completing it. Talking the talk and walking the walk, as we like to say, are two different things.

If I followed through with my diet and exercise plans every time I said I would get in shape, I'd have a cabinet full of Olympic medals. But the cupboard is bare. It's not lying or self-deception. Sometimes my reach exceeds my grasp. However, sometimes, like the second child, I just walk away from a task or a responsibility. Fortunately, I have a spouse who can gently hold me accountable. Sometimes, without even saying a word, a particular look will do. Assisting with accountability is a grace and an imperative in this election year.

As Catholic Christians, we take a pro-life stand. The president tells us that no one will lose health insurance coverage under his administration because of preexisting health conditions. But in the courts, he is doing the exact opposite, seeking to deny Americans health insurance because of preexisting conditions. This could affect 130 million of us. We need to hold him accountable to his promise. His presidential opponent promises to maintain coverage regardless of preexisting conditions and Medicare for all who want it. If he is elected, we will have to make sure he keeps that promise. We cannot allow our leaders to be like the second child in today's gospel. If they talk a pro-life talk, they must walk a pro-life walk.

A wise mother once gave her daughter some dating advice. With young men interested in you romantically, "Disregard everything they say but pay close attention to what they do." Sound advice for her daughter and us.
