Celebration of Mass

On September 29, 2020, our Governor stated that Places of worship may be open to indoor celebrations @ 25% capacity.

Our Pastor, Father Jovito has agreed to the following schedule of indoor masses.

Starting this Sunday, October 4, 2020 there will be an 8:00am and 10:30am, English Mass and 12:30pm, Spanish Mass in the Church. Live Streaming Continues at the 10:30am and 12:30pm masses.

There WILL NOT BE a 2:30pm Hmong Mass or 7pm, Spanish Mass at this time.

Reflection on 27th Sunday in Ordinary Time

Years ago, while teaching religion at Christian Brothers High School, one of my students politely informed me he did not believe in religion. I asked him why he was coming to a Catholic school where religious studies were a requirement. He told me that while he is not religious; he likes to be around people who are. Today we would say that he falls into a group called "spiritual, not religious." Today's Mass readings may shed some light on this way of thinking.

In the passage from Paul's letter to the Philippians, he describes followers of Jesus as; free of anxiety, thankful, truthful, honorable, just, lovely, gracious, excellent, and worthy of praise. Who wouldn't want to hang around with people like that? Most believers are not always this virtuous, but I think we all try to be. Maybe just trying to be honorable is a powerful attraction—Contrast Paul's character sketch to people described on our other two readings.

Isaiah tells us about a landowner with big plans for a vineyard. When the plans don't pan out, the landowner flies into a violent tantrum. Who wants to be around a person like that? The tenants of Matthew's gospel are even worse. Their greed and callousness are murderous. If you see these people heading your way, run for your life!

It disappoints many Christian writers and thinkers that people who identify as spiritual, not religious, don't commit to a church or faith community. If we live up to the standards that Paul gives us and avoid the negativity of characters found in our other two readings, we will attract people. If you build it, they will come. Or maybe not. I think we need to remember the wisdom of St. Augustine. He said that many the church has God does not, and many God has the church does not.
