On September 29, 2020, our Governor stated that Places of worship may be open to indoor celebrations @ 25% capacity.

Reflection on 28th Sunday in Ordinary Time

I taught religion for thirty years in Catholic high schools in Ohio, West Virginia, and California. School cultures in these states differ vastly. But for all their differences, students in each of these three states had one thing in common; they hated their school dress codes. Whether it was strict or lenient, they rebelled against it. When student grumbling went over the top, I would refer them to the story in today's Gospel. A man went to a wedding reception and did not have a proper wedding garment. The King, who was throwing the reception, had the improperly dressed guest bound in chains and cast out into the darkness where there were wailing and grinding of teeth. My students were not amused. From the school's point of view, we intend the dress code to level the playing field. Students from high-income families could afford designer clothes that could make less fortunate students feel self-conscious and out of place. Sometimes for teens being different is social suicide. Parents usually supported reasonable dress codes that help their children look presentable. For students, though, dress codes restricted their freedom of expression. Then came the pandemic and issues like equity and student self-expression took a much different turn.

Today, the wedding feast is a Zoom meeting and the "wedding garment" looks like computers, technological support, and a reliable internet connection. Teachers and school staff need much more professional development if they are to succeed with our students. Catholic schools will require careful planning and enormous financial support if they are to offer a seat at the table for all our students. School families cannot shoulder the burden alone. We, as a community of faith, will have to lend significant financial support. And we will, because we value our schools and endorse their mission.

The King in today's passage wanted to celebrate and so invited family and friends to join him. When he saw that there was still room for others, he asked the appropriately dressed to share in his good fortune. But there was no place for at least one shabbily dressed guest, and that guest was tossed out. Today, in Catholic education, it is not enough to invite everyone. We have to be sure all our students and families have the proper "wedding garment." If someone doesn't, we can't toss them out. We have to find them the right gown.
