Parish Upgrades

Our most recent project walled off and secured our trash bins addressing several longtime issues. We no longer have scavengers rifling through our garbage strewn discarded trash throughout the grounds. We've halted the illegal dumping of garbage in our trash receptacles. And perhaps most importantly we have removed an unsightly eyesore from the grounds. Many of you may have noticed the trash bins parked in front of the hall bursting with garbage as you attended Parish events. While this project was necessary it was also very expensive and stretched our budget during these pandemic times. Reflection on Thirty-Second Sunday in Ordinary Time

In today's Gospel, ten women pass the night awaiting a bridegroom. Five of the women wisely brought extra lamp oil in case the vigil lasted all night. The other five were not so prepared and asked the others to share. Fearing for their own oil reserves, the wise said no and advised the unprepared women to go find their own oil. The bridegroom arrived as the foolish were off looking for oil. They missed the party.

Commentators think the story is really about Christ's disciples awaiting his Second Coming. Some, wisely, are alert and prepared. The oil represents good works; non-transferable. The message is simple; Christ will return at any moment so do good works, prepare for anything, and wise up. But how?

How do we learn to follow Christ? We know him through prayer and sacraments, through scripture and tradition, through personal encounter and in community. As a former religion teacher, I'd like to think we also know him through formal schooling. Church teaching and theological reflection also offer us spiritual wisdom. But I wonder about the effectiveness of our religious education efforts.

When I speak with Baltimore Catechism Catholics, my generation, the conversations usually revolve around theological concepts. We all know why God made us; question #3 in the catechism. With post Vatican II adults in their 40s and 50s, conversations revolve around social justice issues and helping the poor. These are two very different generations with two unique experiences, but we successfully prepared both for discipleship. We have to do the same for the next generation despite political and pandemic challenges. We have to pass on what we have received; the wisdom of discipleship. We can pass the torch to the younger generation, but it's up to them to supply their own oil and keep the flame burning.
