Parish and Diocesan News *(continued)*

Directive from Bishop Soto: Bishop Soto suspending the public celebration of Sunday and weekday Masses for the Diocese of Sacramento California until further notice.

This is in addition to his cancelling of all "non-essential large indoor gatherings" until further notice in response to the Coronavirus outbreak. On November 13, 2020, Bishop Jamie Soto directed the pastors in parishes that are located in "purple tier" counties to offer Mass and provide to the Faithful the opportunity to attend virtually, either by live-streaming or other visual technology starting this Sunday, November 15, 2020, the Thirty-Third Sunday of Ordinary Time. From Bishop Jamie Soto: "This is a heartbreaking decision. My brother priests and many parishioners have worked very hard to provide safe, responsible, outdoor and indoor environments for the Faithful to praise God and receive the sacraments. I am confident that the protocols in place have significantly reduced the risk of infection from the coronavirus and influenza in Catholic churches throughout the Diocese."

"Unfortunately, due to lack of diligence in other social sectors, the rates of COVID-19 infection are surging to dangerous levels. Even our own efforts will not be enough to safeguard the most vulnerable members of our community. For this reason, in the "purple tier" counties, Mass, indoors, is to be offered with no more than 10 people physically present and then be provided to the Faithful through the virtual mediums available."

Our most recent project walled off and secured our trash bins addressing several longtime issues. Reflection on The Solemnity of Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe

How will God judge our lives? Today's reading from Matthew's Gospel tells us that when we feed the hungry, give drink to the thirsty, welcome the stranger, cloth the naked, care for the ill, or visit the imprisoned, we are really ministering not just to the needy but to Christ himself. St. Mother Teresa saw the face of Christ in every dying person she ever picked up off the street. She got it right. She's not the only one.

Frederic Ozanam founded the Society of St. Vincent de Paul in 1833 while still a student at the University of Paris. He and some fellow students put their Catholic faith into practice through prayer and acts of charity for the poor of the city. They called on Sister Rosalie Rendu of the Daughters of Charity for spiritual direction and organizational help. It was Sr. Rosalie who recommended that their new society pattern itself on the example of St. Vincent de Paul. They did. Because of a raging cholera epidemic, she suggested the society organize along neighborhood lines rather in a large group.

The members of the society dedicated themselves to helping the poor. Believing in direct contact with they did works of charity through home visits. They believed in the dignity of the human person they saw Jesus Christ in the face of the poor. Members believed by working with the poor they would become more intimately connected to Jesus Christ. They valued prayer humility, solidarity, friendship and simplicity.

Today there are about 190,000 Vincentians or members of the Society of Saint Vincent de Paul in some 90 countries worldwide. Organized in conferences based out of a particular parish, school, or community center. Dedicated Vincentians help those in need within their local community. Our Parish St Vincent de Paul Society is one of these conferences. We are dedicated to visiting people in need and prior to the pandemic we visited in pairs each family within our parish boundary which contacted us for help. Today we connect virtually or by phone. We pray with people, discuss their immediate needs, and look for ways in which families can overcome financial difficulties. We always conclude with a prayer (and a plug for our parish). At the moment we can give up to \$200.00 in financial help thanks to your financial support. We're not saints, but together as a parish we do minister to the needs of the poor in our neighborhood. Christ the King will judge us justly.
