Reception of Holy Communion:

Beginning Sunday, November 29, 2020, weather permitting, we will be offering the reception of Holy Communion after the 10:30am and the 12:30pm Live Streamed Masses. This will take place outside in the church parking lot. Father will confirm if communion will be happening following the virtual mass. Make sure that you tune in to the virtual mass and not just show up.

Communion will take place immediately after the Final Blessing.

Parishioners will be expected to line up by the Statue of Mary, directly across from the east side parking lot. Communion recipients will need to be 6 feet apart and wearing a mask that covers both the nose and mouth. After receiving communion, you must leave immediately.

Reflection on The Baptism of the Lord

I remember seeing a photo of our former pastor, Fr. Michael Vaughan being baptized. It was on a battlefield. He was a soldier fighting in the first Iraq war. His head was bent over a garbage can and a minister was pouring the baptismal water over his head. When the rite was over he went back to war. But his life was radically changed. After years of training and study, he was ordained a Catholic priest. The rest is, as they say, history. My story is very different.

As a cradle Catholic, I was baptized a week after I was born. At the time I absolutely had no awareness of what was going on. My family gathered at a side altar on a Saturday morning. Our pastor said some prayers in Latin, water was sprinkled on my forehead, and then we all went home for a party. My life went on. I rarely think of my baptism. There are exceptions, like when I am praying the second Luminous mystery of the rosary. Reflecting on today's reading is another.

Jesus humbled himself and submitted to the will of God and was baptized by John. He then went off into the desert where he fasted and prayed. After forty days of that, he emerged to proclaim the gospel, heal the sick, comfort the afflicted, challenge the powers of his day, suffer and die. He also asked his disciples to do the same. It's hard to ignore leaders who lead by example.

Baptism changes everything. Adults know what they are getting into, at least in part. But even those of us who were baptized as infants sooner or later come to the same realization about our lives. Our baptism is followed by a commitment to Christ and his life of prayer, fasting, gospel proclamation, and yes, even suffering and death. But that is not to say that there is no party. Hopefully, we will be celebrating our conversion with Christ eternally.
