### Reception of Holy Communion:

Beginning Sunday, November 29, 2020, weather permitting, we will be offering the reception of Holy Communion after the 10:30am and the 12:30pm Live Streamed Masses. This will take place outside in the church parking lot. Father will confirm if communion will be happening following the virtual mass. Make sure that you tune in to the virtual mass and not just show up. Communion will take place immediately after the Final Blessing.

Parishioners will be expected to line up by the Statue of Mary, directly across from the east side parking lot. Communion recipients will need to be 6 feet apart and wearing a mask that covers both the nose and mouth. After receiving communion, you must leave immediately.

### Reflection on Third Sunday in Ordinary Time

Jesus sums up his gospel message in one sentence, "The Reign of God is at hand, repent and believe the good news." The ordained proclaim this message from the pulpit. It's up to us the laity to spread Christ's gospel to the 99% of the world that lies beyond the walls of our churches. Are we up to the challenge?

Many lack confidence or feel untrained and unqualified to proclaim the gospel. There are many educational opportunities out there, but you don't need a degree in theology to be an effective witness to the gospel. St. Francis instructed his friars to proclaim the gospel and use words when you have to. Actions are more telling than words.

I met two Christian Brothers from Pakistan who ran a school for boys. In their country they are not allowed to dress as Brothers, display religious symbols, or mention the name of Jesus. Yet, they were confident that they were proclaiming not only the gospel of Christ but also the teaching philosophy of St. John Baptist De La Salle. How? They gave witness to the gospel by the way they treated their students and each other with love and respect. Isn't that the way you treat family and friends? You also proclaim the gospel when you pray for people who are suffering or extend a helping hand to people in need.

I listened to President Biden's inaugural address and heard him talk about coming together, helping each other, and treating each other with dignity and respect. Bruce Springsteen sang of a "Land of Hope and Dreams" in the celebration that followed the day's events. They never mentioned Jesus Christ or the Reign of God, but I got the message. Neither of them have a degree in Theology.

### Support AB-15, which will extend the eviction moratorium through the end of the year

According to Assembly Bill 3088, on February 1st, 2021, millions of California tenants could be evicted for unpaid rent during the COVID-19 pandemic if they don't pay at least 25% of their monthly rent that was due between September 1, 2020 and January 31, 2021. To make it worse, one month later starting March 1st, 2021, landlords will be able to sue tenants for all unpaid rent in small claims court. However for millions that lost their income during the pandemic, many have not been able to return to work and federal unemployment benefits have run out, and many others were never able to receive unemployment in the first place. Unless a new bill is passed in January - AB15 - we will begin to see a mass tsunami of evictions, with thousands pushed into homelessness and a level of economic poverty from which they will never be able to recover.
