### Reflection on Fifth Sunday in Ordinary Time

Poor Job sounds like he has a terrible case of the "Lock Down Blues" in today's first reading. He says life is drudgery. We are slaves living in misery. Nights are long and sleepless. Daylight hours fly by. He doesn't even want to get out of bed. If that's not enough, we end up dead. Contrast this with what Mark shows us in today's Gospel passage.

Jesus takes Simon's mother-in-law by the hand and cools her fever. It is a beautiful display of tenderness and compassion. Word of the healing got out and throngs of sick and possessed neighbors crowded into the house. They were vulnerable and poor. At the head of the line was a woman considered a second-class citizen in the culture of their day. No millionaires or celebrities were cutting the line. After a night of healings, Jesus and his disciples re-energize themselves with prayer and then head off to the next town. There, Jesus would again proclaim his gospel in deeds, not words.

These two readings are playing out right in front of us today. The pandemic and the lockdown have many of us losing sleep, feeling anxious. Job's pessimism is all too real. But we also have signs of compassion, tenderness, and hope. I see it in friends and family, but also in the health care workers putting in long hours under harrowing circumstances. I also see it in our essential workers bagging groceries. Like Jesus, these people are proclaiming hope, not just in words but also in deeds. They make the gospel tangible without preaching.

These folks are on to something. We can choose to focus on ourselves and enslave ourselves to our problems like Job. Or, we can step outside of ourselves and help others the way Jesus did, the way our front-liners are doing right now. St. Paul tells us he has made himself a slave to all, in order to save at least some. There are a lot of Pauls' out there today. Thank God.
