Lenten Stations of the Cross

Every Friday during Lent we will have In-door and Live Streamed Stations of the Cross; 3:00pm in English and 5:00pm in Spanish. For the In-Door Stations of the Cross you must remain socially distanced, wearing a mask and stay in a pew. Outside, we will have Stations of the Cross placed throughout the Parking Lot for individual prayer. They will be posted every Friday from 8:00am to 2:30pm.

For In-Door Stations of the Cross, reservations will need to be made by Thursday at noon. The same applies as for masses...we are limited to 71 people and once the Stations have started, the doors will be closed and no one else will be let inside.

Reflection

We always see the gospel in the light of what is going on in our lives. Through the grace of God, the gospel then helps shape the way we live our lives. The pandemic has me noticing things in the gospels that I never did. Last week we read about how Jesus cured Peter's mother-in-law with the touch of his hand. Today's passage shows us Jesus touching a leper, curing him with the touch of his hand. Lockdown allows me to notice and appreciate the power of the human touch. But, with Jesus, there's more to the touch of his hand than meets the eye.

A first-century Rabbi would never touch a woman. He would not defile himself by touching someone that their culture regarded as socially inferior or even unclean. Touching a leper was even worse. The Temple priests quarantined lepers not just to prevent contagion but in the belief that the illness was divine retribution for sinfulness. It was neither healthy nor righteous to extend a hand to a sinner. With the touch of his hand, Jesus humbled himself to serve those in need. The operative word is humility. The impeachment trial in the Senate has us reliving the insurrection of January 6th. There is no shortage of video and stories of personal experiences and heroism. One such story came to mind as I read today's gospel passage. After police secured the Capitol building, they allowed representatives and senators to reenter the building. Most went to their offices and tried to get back to work. Congressional representative Andy Kim of New Jersey did not return to his office. He grabbed a broom and for the next two hours; he joined a maintenance crew and cleared debris desiccation left in the lobby by the insurrectionists. It's not every day that you see a congressman sweeping floors. Touching another person or sweeping a floor is simple and ordinary. But when done in humility, they become heroic. The call to discipleship is a call to humility. Fortunately, Christ offers us the grace to be heroic when we heed his call
