#### Lenten Stations of the Cross

Every Friday during Lent we will have In-door and Live Streamed Stations of the Cross; **5:00pm in English and 7:00pm in Spanish.** For the In-Door Stations of the Cross you must remain socially distanced, wearing a mask and stay in a pew.

Outside, we will have Stations of the Cross placed throughout the Parking Lot for individual prayer. They will be posted every Friday from 8:00am to 2:30pm.

**For In-Door Stations of the Cross, reservations will need to be made by Thursday at noon. The same applies as for masses...we are limited to 71 people and once the Stations have started, the doors will be closed and no one else will be let inside.**

#### Reflection

With the return of purple in our sanctuaries, burying away our "Alleluias" and people giving up something that they enjoy for these forty days, we enter the season of Lent. It's hard to believe that this is our second "COVID Lent". With so many restrictions and guidelines in place to help mitigate the spread of the virus, so many of us have entered some state of complacency.

In today's Gospel passage, Jesus faces a crisis. He confronts evil in the desert. Mark tells us Satan tempted him. Matthew and Luke are more descriptive. They detail three specific temptations. Jesus, of course, rises to the occasion in the face of each.

Pope Francis reflecting on the pandemic tells us we now face three temptations; narcissism, discouragement, and pessimism. Narcissism is a temptation to think only of oneself. We see this in political demagogues and vaccine line cutters. It's easy to be discouraged. The pandemic has brought tremendous pain and disruption. Eventually this discouragement can give in to pessimism and a sense of hopelessness.

Jesus emerged from his crisis of evil in the desert victorious. But he was different, no longer the carpenter's son. He proclaimed the Reign of God, a new world order. Pope Francis tells us we will not be the same when we emerge from the pandemic. We, like Jesus, cannot go back to "normal." We too must seek a better world. We must proclaim the Reign of God.

#### Lenten reflection on Let Us Dream: The Path to a Better Future by Pope Francis

Reflecting on the pandemic, Pope Francis wrote, "This crisis unmasks our vulnerability, exposes the false securities on which we had based our lives. It is time for honest reflection, for owning our roots." Has the pandemic revealed any false securities in your life? Has it forced you to consider your roots, or what is most important in your life?
