Reflection Dei Verbum
In today's passage from the Acts of the Apostles we read, "There was no needy person among them, for those who owned property or houses would sell them, bring the proceeds of the sale, and put them at the feet of the apostles, and they were distributed to each according to need." Does that mean we have to do the same? No.

The official teaching of the Second Vatican Council is that scripture is inspired by God. and written by human beings. The bible's authors and editors reveal eternal truths in temporal language. In order to get to these revealed truths, we must rely on historical and literary analysis and consider the authors' time and the literary forms they are employing. We are not fundamentalists insisting that the bible must be interpreted literally. This passage from today's readings makes this clear.

Christ compels us to address the needs of the poor. The ancient community that the author of Acts is describing accomplished this radically, by selling all their property and giving the proceeds to the poor. Their society was vastly different from ours. We meet the concerns of those in need through charities like the St. Vincent de Paul Society, Loaves and Fishes, or any of the other helping agencies that we support financially. In addition, we lobby our government to promote the common good through the California Catholic Conference of other Catholic lobbying groups. We are as faithful in our commitment to the the poor as the ancient community of today's reading, but fulfill our duty differently.
