#### Reflection:

#### Good Shepherd Sunday

A Franciscan brother dressed in his robes was standing in line one Halloween afternoon when a costumed child behind him asked "who are you supposed to be"? The brother thought for a second. That's a good question. As baptized Christians, who are we supposed to be? Like Christ.

In today's reading from John's gospel, Jesus says, "I am the Good Shepherd." The Good Shepherd lays down his life for his flock and even for those that are not part of his fold. He makes sure sheep don't wander off to get lost and that other flocks join the fold. How's our shepherding doing?

The largest religious denomination in the United States today is Roman Catholicism. That suggests we are doing pretty good at keeping our people in the fold and bringing in others. Unfortunately, the second-largest denomination is former Catholics. How can we be better shepherds? If we practice what we preach and be more like Jesus. He proclaimed the reign of a loving god. He healed the sick, fed the hungry, and forgave the sinner. If we stay true to the Good Shepard, we will be the good shepherds we are called to be.

I associate the image of the Good Shepherd with bishops. Maybe it's the crook they carry at mass? But the truth is we are all called to be Shepherds, not sheep.
