Reflection:

Transformers

An older boy bullied me in grade school. He made fun of my friends and me and pushed us around. High school was worse. He randomly beat kids. We all feared him. Shortly after his graduation, a court convicted him of auto theft. The judge gave him the option of going to prison or enlisting in the Marine Corps. He chose the Marines. Either way, I was relieved. My days of being bullied were over, or so I thought. That was 1966, and I was wrong. There are all kinds of bullies; some are religious.

Take Saul, for example. He called himself a Pharisee's Pharisee and was a zealous enforcer of Jewish religious laws and beliefs. Christians were heretics, in his opinion and he hunted them down, dragging them from their homes and violently bringing them to justice. He even took part in the murder of our first martyr, St. Stephen. When Barnabas announced he would bring Saul to Jerusalem Christians there were fearful. I know exactly how they felt.

Channel surfing during a long car drive 30 years after my last encounter with my bully, I suddenly heard his voice on my radio. My stomach tightened at the sound of his voice. He was talking about anger, hatred, fear, forgiveness, love, and God. It turned out that he was now a bishop! What happened?

Saul encountered the Risen Christ in a blinding light on the road to Damascus, where he intended to arrest Christians. My former bully turned bishop met him while trapped under a collapsed wall for three days outside of Key Sanh in one of the bloodiest battles of the Viet Nam war. The Risen Christ transformed these two repulsive bullies into evangelists. Imagine what conversion can do for the rest of us.
