Reflection:

What Would Peter Do?

Today's first reading reminds me of a high school religion student I once had in class. He said he was not religious, but he enjoyed being around people who were and described himself as spiritual but not religious.

Cornelius was a Roman Centurion, occupying Palestine. He was probably brutal and used his 100 men to maintain order, collect taxes, and crucify Jews. But there was another side to Cornelius. He had a spiritual nature and filled his household with so-called God-fearing people who were attracted to God and Jewish moral beliefs but never formally became Jewish. This was probably because of the religion's diet restrictions and circumcision laws. God sought Cornelius and told him to summon Peter to his household. The centurion obeyed. So did Peter. As a result, he converted the entire household to Christianity. How did Peter do it?

First, he went to the home of Cornelius. He didn't ask the centurion to come to him. Meeting people where they are is a good start. Second, Peter proclaimed the gospel. Third, he recognized the fact that the grace of God, the Holy Spirit, was already upon these people. All he did was affirm their state of grace through baptism.

Reliable polling shows that 23% of American adults identify as Catholic. The same percentage claim no religious affiliation at all. But that does not mean that they are not seeking God. Maybe we should follow Peter's example; reach out to them, proclaim the gospel, and recognize that the Spirit of God may already be upon many of them. The polls also say that Catholics are diminishing while the unaffiliated are increasing. Is it time to knock on doors?
