Reflection: Jesus' Prayer

Today's reading from John's Gospel shows us, Jesus, in conversation with God. His prayer is not the Our Father, but there are petitions. Jesus asks his Father to keep the community of disciples as closely united to each other as he himself is to the Father. Their unity would serve them well when confronted with the challenges the world would throw at them. Jesus saw himself leaving the world and reuniting with the Father. The disciples were to remain here in the world where they would fulfill their calling as disciples. The world is good, but there are dangers. For Jesus, there is only one danger, the "evil one" who snatched Judas from the fold.

People today are more likely to speak of evil in philosophical terms, noting the absence of good. We can also see evil as a dynamic power, like a miracle in reverse, promoting death rather than life. Christians know Satan the tempter, the divider, the scatterer. He is behind those who tempt us to division over race, income, gender, age, or any of the other forms of exclusion. As disciples, we have to follow the example of our Master. He distinguished evil from evil doers, forgave sinners, and welcomed them into the Reign of God. His love and self-sacrifice lead to forgiveness and redemption. He defeated Satan.

We live in a divided culture. Many of us see opponents as Satan. There is only one Satan, and those we disagree with are not him. As disciples, we must confront evil as Christ did. We need to proclaim the Reign of God and welcome all into his company. Evangelization is our antidote to "cancel culture."
