Reflection:

A New Pentecost

At Pentecost, the Holy Spirit descended upon the disciples. They went out and spoke in their native language but were understood by people who spoke different languages and came from different cultures. This is the exact opposite of what we are experiencing today in our culture.

Even though we speak a common language, we can't seem to understand each other. Democrats don't understand Republicans. Republicans don't understand Democrats. Liberals and conservatives find each other's opinions incomprehensible. Within our church, progressives and traditionalists seem deeply divided. The certitude of our opinions is like a blinder that prevents us from seeing the other's point of view. Christianity offers a solution to this dilemma.

The disciples received and listened to the Holy Spirit. They responded to a power greater than themselves. Then, they met people where they were and proclaimed the message in a way that the others could understand. We can do the same. Observers tell us that in order to be heard, we must first listen. Jesus told us that before we can remove the speck from our brother's or sister's eye, we must first remove the plank from our own. That may be the beginning of the new Pentecost that we need.
