Reflection:
Come and Go

When Jesus began his ministry, he
invited his would-be disciples to
come and follow him. In the end,
he commanded them to go and
baptize all nations in the name of
the Father, the Son, and of the Holy
Spirit. We easily associated the
word missionary with heroic Chris-
tians proclaiming the gospel in far-
off countries. True, but that's not all
it means.

Evangelizing all nations is as inclu-
sive as it gets. All nations mean all
people no matter their nationality,
race, ethnicity, gender, sexual ori-
entation, age, level of income, or
political affiliation. James Joyce
got it right when he described
Catholicism as "Here comes every-
body." How do we convert all these
people? We pray. We treat people
with kindness and compassion. We
volunteer at Loaves and Fishes. We
serve as catechists. We contribute
to our St. Vincent de Paul Society. In
short, we act as disciples of Christ.

Before the pandemic, I would occa-
sionally be at the same Mass as the
Missionaries of Charity. I know what
they do and how they live. Just
seeing them made me want to be
a better person and Christian. Few
of us are called to religious life as
they are. But we are all called to be
missionaries like them.
