Reflection:

Corpus Christi

There's been a lot of discussions lately
about communion. A recent Roman
synod asked if those divorced and
remarried should receive. Some US
Bishops are questioning president
Biden's worthiness. Who's worthy?
Pope Francis said the Eucharist "... is
not a prize for the perfect but a pow-
erful medicine and nourishment for
the weak." St. Ambrose taught us that
Christ's blood was shed for the forgive-
ness of sin. The more one sins, the more
one needs communion. St. Paul wrote
that anyone receiving unworthily will
have to answer to God. a more funda-
mental question is not who's in line but
what are they in line for.

Last month the Pew Research Center
reported that two-thirds of American
Catholics do not believe that commu-
nion host is the body and blood of
Christ. Forty-five percent of us never
heard of the doctrine of transubstanti-
ation. We've got a learning problem.
Parents can blame teachers. Teachers
can blame parents. We can all blame
our bishops. Canonically they are the
chief teachers in the diocese. But, fin-
ger-pointing won't solve our problem.

On May 10th, Pope Francis issued a
decree establishing the lay ministry of
catechist. Catechists are the unsung
heroes of our church. Whether dealing
with second graders preparing for com-
munion or adults in the RCIA program
preparing for the sacraments of initia-
tion, these volunteers are worth their
weight in gold. The pope's letter asks
Bishops to provide the new ministry
with material support and the freedom
to seek new teaching methodologies.
We also have an excellent new Directo-
ry for Catechesis. If the bishops follow
the pope's lead, we are on the verge
of a catechetical renaissance. Everyone
in the communion line will know what
they are receiving.
