Parish News

Update of COVID Precautions from Bishop Jaime Soto:

"Starting, Saturday, June 19, 2021, pastors may accommodate the faithful for the celebration of the Sacrifice of the Mass at 100% of the seating capacity in the parish churches.

Bishop Soto is rescinding the general dispensation from the obligation to attend Sunday Mass.

Starting Sunday, June 20, 2021 all the Catholic faithful in the Diocese of Sacramento are obliged to personally attend and actively participate in the Sunday celebration of the Sacrifice of the Mass (Canon 1247).

Pastors and the faithful are counseled that individuals are not obligated to attend the Eucharist on Sunday or other obligatory solemnities if they are sick, have a vulnerable health condition, are caring for someone with a vulnerable health condition, or have other serious reasons (Canon 1245; Catechism of the Catholic Church, 2181).
All the faithful are encouraged to receive the COVID-19 Vaccination, Consult your doctor with any health concerns. The risk of infection still threatens us."

Pastors and the faithful should continue to observe sensible public health precautions:

1. Practice frequent hand washing and use of sanitizer.
2. **Face Masks are still required**
3. Refrain from hand shaking and other physical contact with others outside of one's household
3. Continue to clean pews after Sunday Mass and other days with multiple services
4. Priest, deacons, and Extraordinary ministers should continue to use face masks for the distribution of communion; Have sanitizer available for use when needed.
5. For communion, the distribution of the cup is still suspended.
6. Exchange of the sign of peace during Mass may resume, (a respectful

bow or wave is encouraged).
7. Congregational singing may resume

8. The Divine Mercy Chapel will be open

9. The two front doors will be open before mass. **The outside door on the chapel side will remain closed and used for exiting only.** Ushers/Greeters will need to monitor mask wearing as people enter the church.

10. For Security Reasons: **all doors must remain closed after mass has started. This applies to Adoration and other activities in the church.**

11. **Temperatures will not be taken; Registration will not be necessary.**

12. CCD/Faith Formation Classes may resume in the hall, otherwise, **use of the hall is on hold until further notice from Bishop Soto.**

13. English Adoration will remain on hold until further notice.

14. We will continue to Live Stream the Sacrifice of the Mass for those who are unable to attend as we monitor the number of people who are using this service.

Reflection:

The Prophetic Cycle

Prophets like Ezekiel were not fortune-tellers. God spoke to them through dreams, verbally, or as with Ezekiel, through visions. The prophets then conveyed God's message to the people. Fortunetellers were condemned. Prophets were revered, though usually only after their rejection and deaths. Why was that?

There was a familiar prophetic pattern. Initially, things were going well. The people obeyed and worshiped God and prospered. But then, they forgot about God and felt they could do without God's help. Catastrophe ensued. The people then repented. God forgave them, and prosperity was restored. The prophets arrived on the scene when things were going well, but disaster was just around the corner. Their message to repent fell on deaf ears. Every prophet failed except Jonah, but he prophesied to gentiles.

This prophetic cycle is visible today. Relationships fall apart because people become complacent or self-absorbed. Corporations eventually fail because they put profits above prophets in their companies who tell them to put excellence above earnings. Jesus began his ministry, extolling us to repent and believe the Good News. What do I need to repent? What do we need to repent? The Reign of God is at stake.
