12th Sunday in Ordinary Time - June 20, 2021

Update of COVID Precautions from Bishop Jaime Soto:

"Starting, Saturday, June 19, 2021, pastors may accommodate the faithful for the celebration of the Sacrifice of the Mass at 100% of the seating capacity in the parish churches." Bishop Soto is rescinding the general dispensation from the obligation to attend Sunday Mass. Starting Sunday, June 20, 2021 all the Catholic faithful in the Diocese of Sacramento are obliged to personally attend and actively participate in the Sunday celebration of the Sacrifice of the Mass (Canon 1247). Pastors and the faithful should continue to observe sensible public health precautions:

1. Practice frequent hand washing and use of sanitizer.
2. Face Masks are still required
3. Refrain from hand shaking and other physical contact with others outside of one's household

4. Priest, deacons, and Extraordinary ministers should continue to use face masks for the distribution of communion; Have sanitizer available for use when needed.

5. For communion, the distribution of the cup is still suspended.

6. Exchange of the sign of peace during Mass may resume, (a respectful bow or wave is encouraged).

7. The two front doors will be open before mass. **The outside door on the chapel side will remain closed and used for exiting only.** Ushers/Greeters will need to monitor mask wearing as people enter the church.

8. **For Security Reasons: You will need to be on time - all doors must remain closed after mass has started. This applies to Adoration and other activities in the church.**

9. **Temperatures will not be taken and Registration will not be necessary.**

10. Congregational singing may resume

11. The Divine Mercy Chapel will be open

12. We will continue to Live Stream the Sacrifice of the Mass for those who are unable to attend as we mon-

itor the number of people who are using this service.

Reflection:
Heroic Discipleship

The gospels often portray the disciples as flawed. In today's reading, they appear cowardly. I do not think they are. Fearful of being drowned, the disciples call on Jesus to save them. That sounds like a good idea to me. Many of us are fearful of this pandemic. Fear is a survival instinct. They are not cowards, far from it.

It took courage for the disciples to follow Jesus. They were casting their lot with a religious rebel who was challenging the Jewish establishment and the Roman Empire. The stakes were high, life and death. For at least one of them, getting just into the boat took courage. Matthew was a tax collector and his shipmate, Simon the Zealot, would likely have assisted had it not been for their common discipleship. Tradition tells us all but two of the man in this boat would die a martyr's death. They are not cowards.

In his book, *The Hero Code*, retired SEAL commander William H. McRaven lists ten codes that heroes must follow. One is that to be a hero one must be humble and recognize one's limitations. Seeking help is a sign of strength, not weakness. The disciples had no trouble confessing their weakness and seeking help from Jesus. Disciples, then and now, face fearful circumstances; storms at sea, pandemics, or vaccination fears. Like our ancient predecessors, we can admit our fears and humble ourselves before God. We are called to follow a Christian hero code.
