Update of COVID Precautions from Bishop Jaime Soto:

"Starting, Saturday, June 19, 2021, pastors may accommodate the faithful for the celebration of the Sacrifice of the Mass at 100% of the seating capacity in the parish churches." Bishop Soto is rescinding the general dispensation from the obligation to attend Sunday Mass. Starting Sunday, June 20, 2021 all the Catholic faithful in the Diocese of Sacramento are obliged to personally attend and actively participate in the Sunday celebration of the Sacrifice of the Mass (Canon 1247). Pastors and the faithful should continue to observe sensible public health precautions:

1. Practice frequent hand washing and use of sanitizer.
2. **Face Masks are still required**
3. Refrain from hand shaking and other physical contact with others outside of one's household
4. Priest, deacons, and Extraordinary ministers should continue to use face masks for the distribution of communion; Have sanitizer available for use when needed.
5. For communion, the distribution of the cup is still suspended.
6. Exchange of the sign of peace during Mass may resume, (a respectful bow or wave is encouraged).
7. The two front doors will be open before mass. **The outside door on the chapel side will remain closed and used for exiting only.** Ushers/Greeters will need to monitor mask wearing as people enter the church.

8. PLEASE BE ON TIME!! For Security Reasons: You will need to be on time - all doors must remain closed after mass has started. This applies to Adoration and other activities in the church.

9. Temperatures will not be taken and Registration will not be necessary.

10. Congregational singing may resume
11. We will continue to Live Stream the Sacrifice of the Mass for those who are unable to attend as we monitor the number of people who are using this service.

Reflection:
To Infinity and Beyond!

Jairus, in our gospel reading, was a synagogue official, a prominent member of the religious establishment. He was probably well off and had access to the finest health care of his day. But despite all this, his daughter remained deathly ill. In desperation and willing to try anything, he turned to a little-known itinerant Rabbi whom he heard had performed miracles. Sadly, many parents have experienced similar desperation and fears. I have.

One of my daughters was ill with severe headaches. It baffled her doctors. They subjected her to several medical tests, some of them painful. My wife and I suffered from the agony of not knowing what was happening. I turned to prayer. Pacing in my backyard I clutched my bible the way Linus clutched his blanket in the Peanuts cartoons of Charles Schulz and pleaded with God. I opened the bible randomly and my eyes fell upon today's reading. From somewhere in the universe I heard a voice say, "She will be all right." It was not my voice, and I heard it in my mind, not in my ears. I felt relieved knowing my daughter would be ok. The next day a doctor called. Our daughter was having an allergic reaction to a medication she was taking. All would be well.

Last week comedian Tim Allen from Home Improvement, Last Man Standing, and known as the voice of Buzz Lightyear, gave a commencement speech at Hillsdale College. He recalled the lowest moment in his life, doing time in prison for selling drugs. He felt at the end of his rope when amazingly he heard a voice in his head assuring him that all would be well. He believed, and his life turned around. In this pandemic, many of us are feeling fear and desperation. Many of us are hearing the same voice that Tim Allen and I heard. It may sound like it's from "...infinity and beyond." But I think it's the same voice that Jairus heard when in desperation he turned to that little-known, itinerant rabbi from Nazareth.
