Update of COVID Precautions from Bishop Jaime Soto:

Bishop Soto is rescinding the general dispensation from the obligation to attend Sunday Mass. As of Sunday, June 20, 2021 all the Catholic faithful in the Diocese of Sacramento are obliged to personally attend and actively participate in the Sunday celebration of the Sacrifice of the Mass (Canon 1247). Our church is currently open 100% of the seating capacity.

1. PLEASE BE ON TIME!! For Security Reasons: You will need to be on time - all doors must remain closed after mass has started. This applies to Adoration and other activities in the church.

2. Face Masks are still required

3. Refrain from hand shaking and other physical contact with others outside of one's household

3. Priest, deacons, and Extraordinary ministers should continue to use face masks for the distribution of communion; Have sanitizer available for use when needed.

4. The two front doors will be open before mass. The outside door on the chapel side will remain closed and used for exiting only. Ushers/Greeters will need to monitor mask wearing as people enter the church.

5. We will continue to Live Stream the Sacrifice of the Mass for those who are unable to attend as we monitor the number of people who are using this service.

Closing/Sending Forth This is my Song

Reflection: Miraculous Remedies

Today, Mark presents us with a rare example of Jesus failing to perform miracles. The problem was people's lack of faith. His miracles required humility and an openness to trust. How can we be more open to Faith? Saint Paul tells us that God extends grace to all of us and that this grace is sufficient. As Catholics, we experience the grace of God in our prayer life, through our good works, and especially through the sacraments.

The Eucharist is central. Our Catechism calls the Mass the sacrament of the sacraments. There we receive the body and blood of Christ himself. It is not just symbolic. In his encyclical, Evangelii Gaudium, Pope Francis said that communion is "... not a prize for the perfect but a powerful medicine and for the nourishment for the weak." But in order to receive this Eucharistic medicine, we have to first receive some medicinal medicine.

We are slowly getting back to our normal worship life and it's wonderful to be back in the pews! As more people get vaccinated more of us will feel safe and comfortable with Mass in person. The problem we face is that less than 50% of county residents are fully vaccinated despite the ready availability of the vaccine. Some of us are hesitant because of fear, previous unpleasant experiences, or a medical conditions. But some of us have fallen victim to the misinformation and disinformation that is out there. Some of us may just be procrastinating. We need to encourage others to trust the thousands of people who are working on the vaccine and the vaccination programs. Getting through this pandemic will be miraculous and, as today's gospel tells us, miracles require our faith and trust.
