#### Update of COVID Precautions from Bishop Jaime Soto:

Bishop Soto is rescinding the general dispensation from the obligation to attend Sunday Mass.

As of Sunday, June 20, 2021 all the Catholic faithful in the Diocese of Sacramento are obliged to personally attend and actively participate in the Sunday celebration of the Sacrifice of the Mass (Canon 1247).

Our church is currently open 100% of the seating capacity.

**1. PLEASE BE ON TIME!! For Security Reasons: You will need to be on time - all doors must remain closed after mass has started. This applies to Adoration and other activities in the church.**

**2. Face Masks are still required**

**3. Priest, deacons, and Extraordinary ministers should continue to use face masks for the distribution of communion;**

**4. The two front doors will be open before mass. The outside door on the chapel side will remain closed and used for exiting only. Ushers/Greeters will need to monitor mask wearing as people enter the church.**

**5. We will continue to Live Stream the Sacrifice of the Mass for those who are unable to attend as we monitor the number of people who are using this service.**

#### Reflection:

**The Lord is My Shepard**

In last Sunday's gospel, Jesus sent out his disciples to proclaim the word, confront evil, and heal the sick. The throngs of people flocking to Jesus in today's gospel are a testimony to their success. They gathered a flock together rather than scattering the sheep as Jeremiah says false shepherds do, Our American bishops can do likewise today.

There is a lot in the press about the US Conference of Catholic Bishops' proposed document on the Eucharist. It would excommunicate Catholic politicians who support pro-choice laws. The Vatican and several bishops fear that such a stance would drive some Catholics away from the church. But other bishops maintain that the proposed document intends to address the need to shore up our belief in the Real Presence of Christ in communion. Recent polling shows that nearly two-thirds of American Catholics see the host as merely symbolic and not actually Christ's body and blood. Will the bishops reaffirm the mystery and beauty of the Eucharist and unite us or divide and scatter us over politics?

We have to count on our bishops and the Vatican to lead us in righteous paths through the dark valley and past evil foes, to God's house. There, in goodness and kindness, we will dine at the table of the Lord just as the psalmist tells us in today's Responsorial Psalm.
